





3 TYPES OF OLD TESTAMENT LAWS



Examples of Civil Laws


- · Laws about leprosy in buildings (Lev. 14:33-53)
- · Laws about moving property boundaries (Deut. 19:14)
- Laws about where to go for judgments, including the law for jealous husbands (Num. 5:11-31)
- · Laws about inheritance (Deut. 21:17)
- · Cities of refuge (Num. 35)
- . Dealing with oxen that gore people (Ex. 21:28-36)

Examples of Ceremonial Laws

- . The sacrificial system (Lev. 1-5)
- Laws regarding feasts and solemn assemblies (Lev. 23)
- · Laws about priestly garments and ordination (Ex. 28-29)
- · Circumcision (Lev. 12:3)

CEREMONIAL LAW

"It was symbolic for the present time in which both gifts and sacrifices are offered which cannot make him who performed the service perfect in regard to the conscience—concerned only with foods and drinks, various washings, and fleshly ordinances imposed until the time of reformation." (Hebrews 9:9-10)



The Ceremonial Law involves everything related to the Sanctuary and Israel's religious festivals.


God instituted this Law to teach His plan of Salvation. All rites and ceremonies represented the ministry of Jesus Christ.


The Ceremonial Law was fulfilled in Christ, so those rules are not mandatory for the believer anymore.

Nevertheless, we can better understand Jesus' redeeming work by studying that Law.

- The Seed; of Eve, Abram, David






The Purpose of the Law Galatians 3:19-25

OBSERVATIONS ABOUT HEBREWS:

- Many regard the Book of Hebrews as the 14th epistle of Paul.
- The 3rd century theologian, Origen wrote: "Who it was that really wrote the epistle (Hebrews), God only knows."
- The Book of Hebrews shows the superiority of Christianity over the Judaic system under the Law of Moses.
- A majority view seems to be that the recipients of Hebrews probably lived in Rome. Hebrews 13:24 - "Those from Italy greet you."
- The recipients of the Book of Hebrews:
 - . had become Christians by hearing the preaching of those who had been evewitnesses of Christ. 2:3
 - Were not recent converts (novices). 5:12
 - Had become "Dull of hearing" (5:11) and were in danger of drifting away from Christ.
- There are nearly 100 Old testament references in the Book of Hebrews, all of which are from the Septuagint version.
- Exodus and Leviticus are especially helpful in understanding Hebrews.
- Prominent words in the Book of Hebrews include:
 - · "Better"
- · "Heavenly"
- · "Perfect"
- · "By faith"

- The basic theme of Hebrews is found in the word "better," in describing the superiority of Christ in both His person and His work. Christ provides:
 - Better revelation, 1:1-2
 - Better expectation. 6:9
 - Better priesthood. 7:7-11, 20-28
 - Better hope. 7:19
 - · Better testament, covenant. 7:22, 8:6
 - Better promises. 8:6
 - Better sacrifices, 8:6
 - Better possessions. 10:34
 - · Better country. 11:16
 - Better resurrection. 11;35
 - Better things. 11:40; 12:24
- In his Person, Christ is better than:
 - The angels
 - Moses
 - Joshua
- In His Performance, Christ provides:
 - A better priesthood
- · A better sanctuary

For the Law, since it has only a shadow of the good things to come and not the very form of things, can never, by the same sacrifices which they offer continually year by year, make perfect those who draw near.



Hebrews 10:1

Applying the 3 law categories today as Christians.

- Follow the NT's instruction regarding these laws.
 - Deut. 14 covers laws about clean and unclean <u>food</u>.
 - Mark 7 and Acts 10 teach that Christians do not need to follow those rules - they were part of the civil law.
 - But, moral laws are repeated or even amplified in the NT, like "do not murder" are valid for Christians today.
 - They are part of doing the "good works" that we've been saved by grace to do (Eph. 2:9-10).
- Understand what these laws teach us about God's character.
 - Deut. 22:11 forbids the Israelites from mixing wool and linen to remind them about God's holiness and the nation's distinctness.
 - We don't have to obey this civil law, but it tell us much about God.
- Appreciate Jesus' perfection because he <u>upheld</u> all these laws.
 All of them.
- These laws are quite instructive for our lives as Christians.
- They point us again and again to our need for a Savior!


Righteousness of WORKS vs. Righteousness of FAITH



- LOST 1
