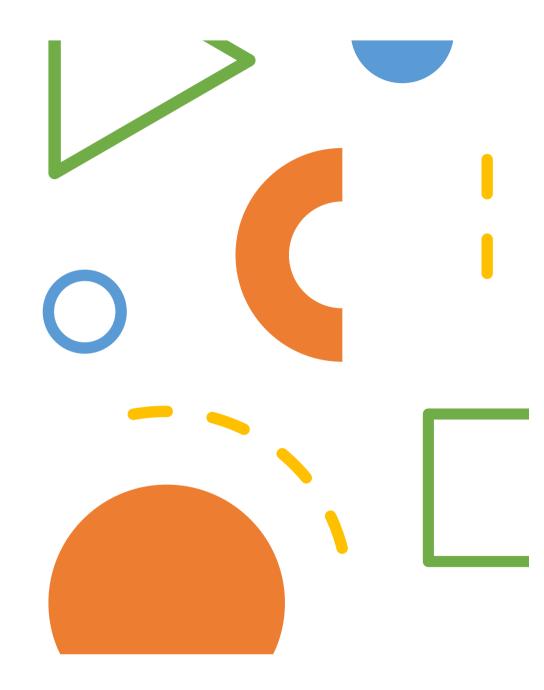

Note: The Balance Sheet does not reflect the payments made-to-date in respect of the earlier pre-app for St Edmund's. This expense will be part of the total project costs which will be repayable to the Diocese in due course.

Parish Financials – Commentary

Summary

- 2021 reflected a deficit of £(11,375) compared with £(17,325) for 2020 and £(11,013) for 2019. While Outgoings have remained mostly unchanged the year-end numbers reflect, in part, the impact of COVID on Mass collections.
- There have been no significant Maintenance / Establishment expense to report for 2021 but we must recognise that we have to preserve the fabric of all Church buildings until there is a conclusions on the buildings review.
- Extraordinary expense in 2022 thus far relates to fence work at St Joseph's and St Edward's totalling £2,000 with an insurance claim received for £1,400.

Income

Offertory & Collections of £67,111 account for 75% of the Parish's income and in-line with 2013 – 2019 financials average.

Offertory & Collections £5,600 higher than 2020.

Total Offertory compares with some £82,000 pre-COVID.

During 2021 we introduced contactless giving and the full year impact was that the 2021 Cash Offertory amounted to £5,000 and that for Contactless was £4,700.

The Parish extends its thanks to those families who have moved their Offertory donations from cash or envelope to Standing Order and also thanks to all who have maintained their donations during COVID.

Gift-Aid remains a critical component of Parish income. The reduction from £16,900 in 2020 to £12,700 in 2021 reflects the reduction in Offertory and timing of HMRC payments. Gift Aid recovery in 2019 calendar was £18,905.

Outgoings

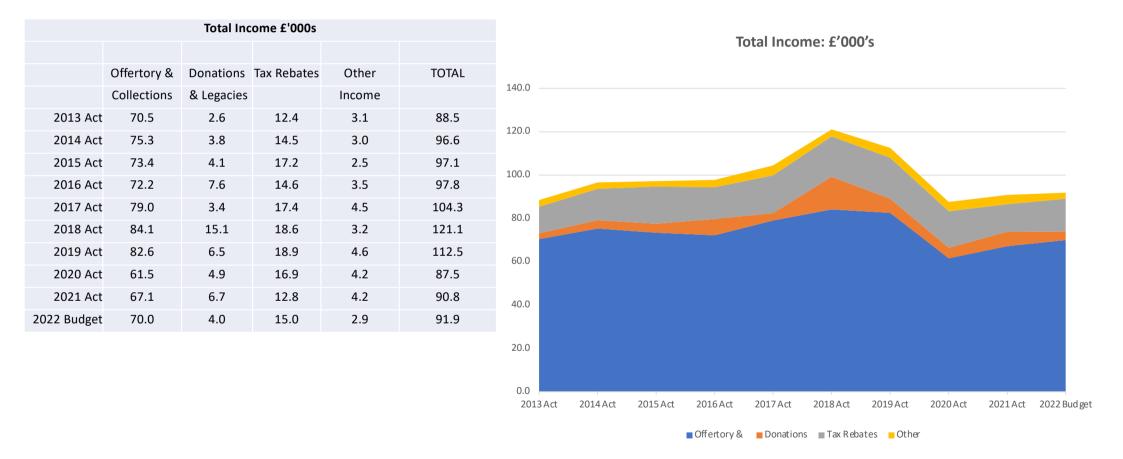
There have been no significant changes in Outgoings in 2021 compared with 2020 although it should be noted that the total Diocesan levy of £20,973 is some £4,600 lower than the 2020 payment of £25,568 reflecting the impact of COVID on Offertory.

Parish payments in respect of Welfare (Poor and LOAF) were £3,008 compared with £1,147 in 2020. The 2019 payment reflects the collection for a young parishioner, now deceased..

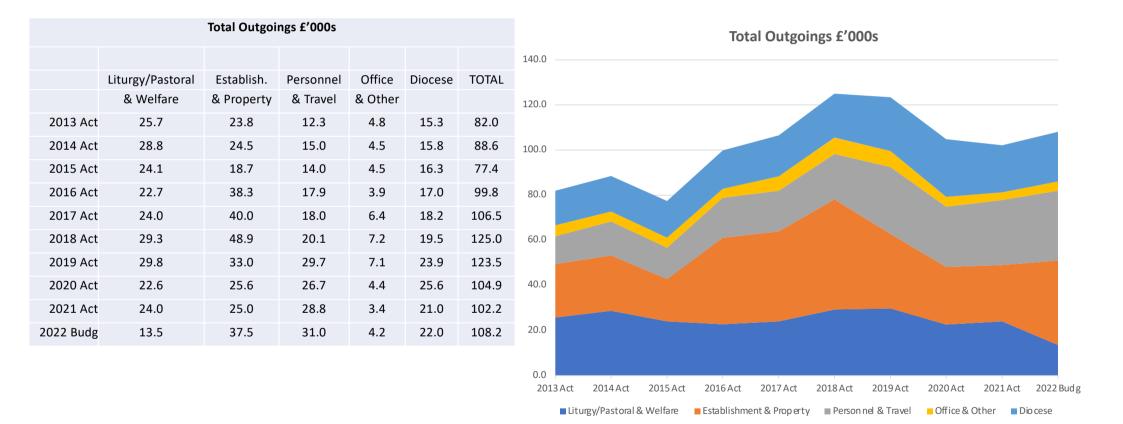

Parish Financials: Income Area Charts 2013 – 2021 plus 2022 Budget



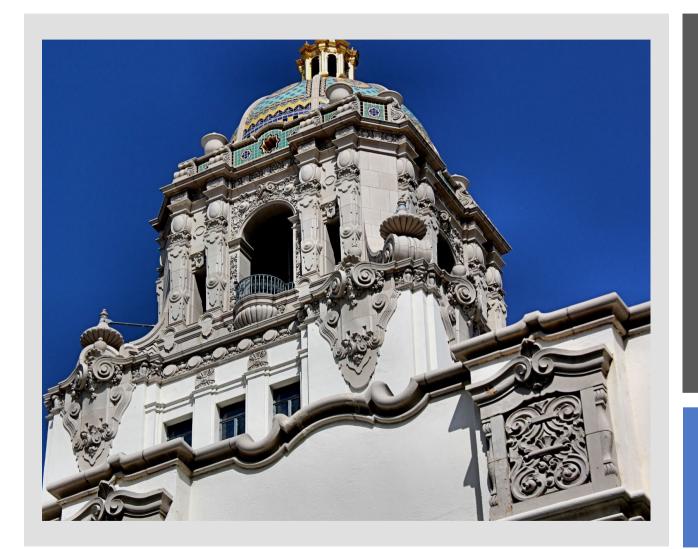
Parish Financials: Expense Area Charts 2013 – 2021 plus 2022 Budget

Maybe not looking quite like that

Buildings

- Church buildings are an important tool for mission, but not the whole mission
- Take formal planning and conservation advice (May August 2022)
 - Access and amenity at Croft Road & residential development in Milford
 - Using sketches showing approximate scale and nature of development
- Check costings and valuations, conduct environmental / sustainability appraisal (September 2022)
- Prepare SWOT analysis on the two options (October 2022)
- Present to parish for conversation and feedback (Late 2022)
- With approval of Bishop, progress sale and design (2023)
