Text: II Corinthians 1:1-11

Title: Blessed Be the God of All Comfort

A. vs. 3 - Blessed Be God who is the source of all comfort.

1. Having been created in God's image, we all have the capacity to comfort others.

2. God's comfort is the greatest comfort of all.

B. vv. 4-5 - Blessed be God, who is able to comfort us at all times.

1. God comforts us in all of our troubles.

2. God's comfort overflows.

C. vv. 6-7 - Blessed Be God who afflicts and comforts us for our good.

1. We are able to endure all things through the comfort of God.

2. Endurance leads to eternal life.

D. vv. 8-11 - Blessed Be God who has proven Himself to be the comforter.

Westminster Shorter Catechism #95: *Who should be baptized?*

Those who are not members of churches should not be baptized until they have publicly stated that they believe in Christ and will obey Him, but the infant children of church members should be baptized.
