



From the Pastor

"When You . . .Travel"

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." - Isaiah 43:2-3a



Have you ever had one of those trips? You know what I mean. One of those trips that seemed like everything that could go wrong was going wrong or was about to go wrong. With June comes the start of the family vacation season. Most of the time those vacations go well. Sometimes there can be some challenges.

I remember a trip that I took with my parents to my cousin's wedding in Junction City, Oregon. We decided to drive there from my hometown in Huron, South Dakota. It would be a 1,600 mile trip going up through Montana; a 25 hour trip driving straight through. But just 2 hours into our trip, as we neared Pierre, South Dakota, the water pump went out on the car. We were stranded out on the highway in the hot July sun. In those days, we did not have a smart phone or even a cell phone. However, the Lord sent someone, who stopped along to the road to help us. He drove my dad to town to get a new water pump and since my dad always travelled with his tool box, he was able to do the repairs himself. It took about three hours and then we were back on the road. Thankfully, we had no other troubles.

Paul had some travel troubles too. In Acts 27:13-44, Paul is heading to Rome on a boat. It seems like a trip where everything was going wrong. When a strong wind came up called, "The Northeaster", they could not get into a safe port on the island of Crete. As the wind blew, they were tossed to and fro until they were shipwrecked on an island, lost. Thankfully, Paul did not have Gilligan on the ship but Paul did have God there. It was the Lord who kept Paul and all those on the ship safe and brought them safely through the storm. Even though they had to abandon ship, everyone was "brought safely to land." (Acts 27:44).

In the Old Testament, God brought His people safely through the water of the Red Sea and Jordan River to the safety of the Promised Land. Today, God is no less present with His people. He is with you and me as we travel. When things go wrong, He is there, helping us through whatever challenges may arise. I know that He was with me and my parents and sent someone to help us. He took care of Paul and the others as they landed on Malta and were cared for by the people there. We never know what may happen on a vacation trip. My prayer is that yours will be uneventful and relaxing. However, should things go wrong, there is One who is there with you. He is your Protector and Savior; the Holy One of Israel!

Meeting Location-Immanuel Sterling

Call to Order

Immanuel Vice Chair, Rick Thies called the meeting to order. Pastor Kohlmeyer opened with prayer.

Minutes:

Minute notes from January 12, 2022, were presented for review. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Steve Bartels, seconded by Sam Kuhl. Motioned carried.

Pastor's Report: (See attached 1st quarter report). Pastor reviewed the worship attendance totals and activities including baptisms, funerals, and transfers/removals.

It was reported that Patty Harms and Deb Buehler are the co-chairs for Immanuel's 150th Anniversary. Also, Donna Rathe and Theresa Haynes are co-chairs for the pictorial directory from Immanuel. St John's is still discussing the directory. The joint directory is all on-line and each church will plan to set-up their own times for pictures, etc.

Also, Pastor indicated that he will be working with the elders to designate a special Sunday for the 175h anniversary of the Synod. This special event will most likely be held in the fall.

Pastor indicated that he had been contacted by the People's City Mission (PCM) regarding their Toss Box (big red box) sponsor program. A small box is \$1200 and larger box is \$2000. 50% of the proceeds collected from the Toss Box would be divided between the churches and PCM for fundraising purposes. Consensus from the group indicated since we are already collecting items for PCM; we are not interested in participating at this time.

St John's is the host for the Circuit Reformation Services that will be held on October 30th at 3 PM. Reverend Hesham Shehab will be the guest preacher for both congregations that Sunday. There is also a planned supper to be catered by Scotty's for \$11/per plate. Both congregations are asked to help with desserts. Amy Borrenpohl is the chair for fundraising. Orphan Grain Train Christmas Gift Boxes information from Grace, Norfolk

Amazing! That sums up last summer's Orphan Grain Train Christmas Box project. At the end of our project last year 1,902 Christmas boxes were ready to be delivered to Orphan Grain Train, all packed with donations collected last summer. Over that previous three years we have sent 4,161 boxes to children around the world who rarely receive any gifts. Some do not own anything other than the clothes on their back. Some do not know the Christmas story. Our goal this year is to share another 2,000 gift boxes through Orphan Grain Train so even more children can hear the Christmas story. You can help us fill these boxes using monetary gifts or donations of clothes and toys. Each box contains a t-shirt, socks, underwear, coloring book, stickers, crayons, ball, toothbrush, stuffed animal, and toy. The boxes are for children ages 2 to 12. We are collecting new underwear, new socks, 24 count boxes of crayons, coloring books, pages of stickers, plastic and rubber balls, and toothbrushes in individual packages. Used items to be donated include t-shirts, stuffed animals, and toys including dolls, Barbies, blocks (Legos, Duplos, wooden), baseball gloves, and children's puzzles. Monetary donations (marked "Grace Lutheran Christmas Box Project") can be sent to Grace Lutheran Church or Orphan Grain Train, Norfolk, NE. We are collecting donations through July 31st. If you have any questions or would like to help pack the boxes, contact Kelly Asbury at 402-371-3521. You can help these children know they are precious and that Jesus is the greatest gift of all!
