THREE DOLLARS WORTH OF GOD

Wilbur Rees once wrote the following describing the average man's view of God:

"I would like to buy \$3 worth of God please, not enough to explode my soul or disturb my sleep, but just enough to equal a cup of warm milk or a snooze in the sunshine. I don't want enough of him to make me love a black man or pick beets with a migrant. I want ecstasy, not transformation; I want the warmth of the womb, not a new birth. I want a pound of the eternal in a paper sack. I would like to buy \$3 dollars worth of God please."

Disturbingly familiar isn't it? We want to believe that there is a good and gracious God who loves and accepts all people, but suggest that this same perfect Being might also be moral, Holy, righteous and pure; or that He may ask something of us in return and suddenly our enthusiasm to know Him begins to wane.

The call of God for each man and woman is to a changed life. He is bidding us to come to him, to embrace Him – all of Him, and having been with Him to go forth from His presence and be an agent of change in the world.

We change the world by being part of His church, His instrument for global transformation. His church is not a social club, a convenience store, or a spa, it is an army, a family and it is His Body reaching out to the world. We, the church, His body are His only means for global transformation. We are His feet, His hands, His voice, His heart; to care for the lost, the broken, the rejected and the weak.

Perhaps this revelation, that we the church are His only option for reaching the world, is so uncomfortable, that we would prefer the \$3 dollars worth of God instead. Three dollars worth may be comfortable, but it is not what we, the church, were made for!

with him and he might send them out to preach ¹⁵ and have authority to cast out demons. ¹⁶He appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); ¹⁷ James the son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); ¹⁸ Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Zealot, ¹⁹ and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

This is a commissioning narrative, utilizing the language of election—called, wanted, came, appointed. It stands as a divine appointment in salvation history. There was an exchange of soul, and ultimately a profound identification—word for word, breath for breath, emotion for emotion, volition for volition.²

By selecting twelve apostles, Jesus was sending an unmistakable message to the leaders of Israel that they were spiritually disqualified, and therefore shut out of His kingdom. He confronted them directly, publicly, and repeatedly with such denunciations. Instead of repenting, their determination to kill Him increased.

Two reasons why He appointed the twelve

First, so that they would be with Him. By constantly spending intimate time with Jesus, the Twelve would be personally mentored by the Messiah Himself.

Second, Jesus appointed these men so that He could send them out to preach. They were trained to be the first generation of heralds of the good news of salvation, following in the footsteps of their Lord.

Jesus also gave them authority to cast out the demons.

Matthew 10:1 adds that they were also given the power "to heal every kind of disease and every kind of sickness." In order to authenticate their position as His representatives,

Jesus gave them authority in both the physical realm (over disease) and the spiritual realm (over demons). Like Jesus Himself, their message was confirmed by the supernatural signs that they performed by His power.

Conclusion

1. Discipleship is Christlikenes.

To follow Christ is to try to emulate him in every area of our lives and to live out an explicitly Christ-centered life.

Popular Appeal

Mark 3:7-9 (ESV)

Jesus withdrew with his disciples to the sea, and a great crowd followed, from Galilee and Judea ⁸ and Jerusalem and Idumea and from beyond the Jordan and from around Tyre and Sidon. When the great crowd heard all that he was doing, they came to him. ⁹ And he told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, lest they crush him,

Jesus's remarkable healing powers had mesmerized the people.

Nothing certainly like it in the experience of these people. Massive healings happening before their eyes, people being delivered from demons. It was a wonder of wonders, the likes of which no one could ever imagine, miraculous displays unlike anything in history. The Lord's miracles were public and undeniable, which is why the people kept coming. No one questioned His miracles. There is no record of any effort to deny any of them.¹

Power and Authority

Mark 3:10-12 (ESV)

for he had healed many, so that all who had diseases pressed around him to touch him. ¹¹And whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him and cried out, "You are the Son of God." ¹²And he strictly ordered them not to make him known.

This is a cosmic battle, and Jesus's victory is overwhelming and final.
