What beside change is a constant we can be sure of?

As a kid I remember folks talking about "where were you when..." The phrase was often followed by a date in history that I was finding out about in school textbooks with black and white photos. Where were you when... Pearl Harbor happened? The bomb was dropped? Kennedy was shot? Armstrong walked on the moon? These were all things that "old people" remembered vividly. They could intimately describe where they were in the living room, or where they were driving and what car they were in, when the earth-shattering news came across the radio. The news ushered in a new reality for them even if it happened on the opposite side of the globe not just down the street.

I thought I'd gotten old enough to be counted among those experienced wizened folks who'd seen a thing or two. I can remember when... the space shuttle exploded, Columbine occurred, the new millennium started, the twin towers came down, and the housing bubble burst. Each one of those earth-shattering events changed our society, our economy, our outlook in some way that eventually traced its way back to impacting me individually. I watch great movies from the pre-millennium and notice things that don't line up with my current reality. There are people smoking in restaurants, standing at the gate to send off loved ones on their flight, and skylines of NY that include twin towers.

With predictions of more variants of COVID and possible other pandemics to come I wonder what our society will look like once we are truly able to get past all these threatening pandemics. What will we look like post-COVID 19? Will we gasp when movies portray people shaking hands when they greet? Will we look at past sports gatherings with people packed in stadiums and giggle at people being so silly to flaunt the social distancing rule? Its all a rather big question mark! I agree with most pundits who predict there will be some sensible and irrational long-term changes coming down the pike for our society and globe.

I've had people quote to me that old adage "There's no constant in life other than change." As a Christian I'd like to say there is a second constant in life. In fact, I'd argue it's really not a second constant, but rather it's a **primary** constant in life. What is that primary constant? It's "the love of God through Christ Jesus." Since Jesus' resurrection we've been assured God's love will never run out or wear out. The apostle Paul puts it this way "38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

That constant love of God through Christ Jesus remains the same for us whether there is change or not, a coronavirus or not, a crisis or not. Times may change but God is timeless. Fashions will fade, but God's love never fades. World records will be broken, and earthshattering events forgotten but God's promises will remain, and God will never forget his redeemed adopted cherished children. In the midst of all these annoying, trying, and sometimes frightening changes in life, we can find peace and hope in the constant love of God in Christ Jesus. 500 years from now all these things we're so frightened by and concerned about will be forgotten footnotes. But we will have only brushed the surface of an eternity in the constant loving present of God through Christ Jesus. Praise God!

Speaking of constants, the writer of Hebrews reminds us "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." With that faithful "primary" constant in your life, the secondary constant of change in life isn't nearly as frightening.

Youth News

Youth Planning Meeting Notes 05-15-22

8 YOUTH and 10 ADULTS ATTENDED

In 1897, Mark Twain was living in London for a summer when he was contacted by an American reporter checking on the recently announced death of Samuel Clemens (Twain's given name) from Missouri, to inquire if it was indeed the famous writer who had died. Twain explained that his cousin also named Samuel Clemens had recently died but humorously responded "The reports of my death are greatly exaggerated!" Twain would go on to live another seven years, dying in 1904.

The good news for FELC is the reports of the death of FELC's youth group are "greatly exaggerated." Pastor Mike sent two post cards and sent an automated text to youth and parents inviting them to a Youth Group Planning meeting. On Sun. May 15, eight youth from grades 6-12, and ten adults responded to an invite on restarting FELC's youth program. Pastor and Brad Kirkwood welcomed the group with a registration sheet and a mixer/game of "Who am I?" With each individual getting a picture of a "character" taped to their back and having to play "20 questions?" with others in attendance to determine who their character was.

After the mixer a light dinner of pizza and snacks was provided. Following the meal, Pastor Mike led a short devotion centered on "The pursuit of the Trivial" using the characters that were identified during the mixer and how these folks are "social influencers" that some of us know and are influenced by, and others don't know, and think are trivial. Using Philippians 3:4-12 pastor discussed what the Apostle Paul listed as important for many people in his day and how Paul considered it "skubala" compared to the importance of knowing Christ. Pastor concluded with stating that a good youth group is about pursuing not the trivial or even the "trappings" of a youth program- fundraisers, numbers, even bible studies. As good as that all sounds; it's all trivial if at the end of the day or your life...you don't know Christ and have a saving relationship with him. FELC's youth program shouldn't be considered trivial but an important part of planting an eternal seed of salvation in each participant's life: youth or adult.

This led into the discussion of "what do folks wish to see in a youth program?" After some discussion the consensus centered around a youth group based on **Christian fellowship**, **study**, **and service**. An additional focus of fundraising was suggested but the group felt it could be part of fellowship or service for now. Discussion then turned to "what kind of schedule would be helpful for FELC's youth ministry?" Sundays were identified as the preferred day for gatherings. It was also identified that for now there was not a need to meet every Sunday. Then two prominent ideas of when to gather (immediately following church or on Sunday evenings) was discussed. The pros and cons were bantered about, and it was suggested that we do a "taste test" over the summer of first Sunday of the month have youth group following church and the third Sunday of the month have youth group in the evening.

The suggestion of forming a youth council so the youth had a voice and say in the programming was heartily supported. The first "youth council" meeting will be Sun. May 29 during the Sunday School hour, any youth in attendance will be considered part of the youth council. The parent/guardian role was discussed. Pastor is willing to lead if parent/guardians provide the "two deep" supportive cast around him. The adults in attendance were very supportive of this idea. The youth suggested a movie night with discussion for one of their upcoming events- this will be taken up at the youth council meeting on Sun. May 29. Nick Abreu volunteered to help facilitate the youth council meeting. The meeting ended with the "all purpose confirmation prayer."

The first "restart the youth" event will be the first Sunday of June following the service from noon to 1:30 pm. The third Sunday of June the youth will meet at 6:30 pm.

JUNE 5TH- YOUTH GROUP MEETING: Our summer schedule of youth group on the first and third Sundays begins Sun. June 5th. The first Sunday of the month we'll gather early right after church and the third Sunday of the month we'll gather later in the evening at 6:30 pm. Sun. June 5th we'll start by sampling the church's potluck and then gather in the youth room for a devotion and a "Head's Up" tournament. What's "head's up?" come find out.

JUNE 19TH- YOUTH GROUP MEETING: Tentative plans are to have a movie night starting at 6:30 pm. So far, the movie is TBD but we're working on movie theater freshly popped popcorn, bunches of bean bag seating, and a large screen experience by projecting it on the fellowship hall wall. Watch your bulletin for further details.

JOIN US FOR THE "BIRTHDAY FOR THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH" Pentecost


