LESSONS FROM FIRST SAMUEL by Dean Hansen

1 Samuel 15:23-24 Because King Saul didn't kill the king of the Amalekites or the best of their animals, Samuel told King Saul, "Because you have rejected the word of the Lord, He has rejected you as king. Then Saul said to Samuel, "I have sinned. I violated the Lord's command and your instructions. I was afraid of the men and so I gave in to them."

LESSONS TO LEARN:

- Confess and Repent.
 - When we have sinned by breaking one of God's commands it is good for us to confess to God that we have sinned, but we must also decide to avoid sinning in the future. That is called repenting.
 - In 1 Samuel 15:24 Saul said "I have sinned" but he didn't really show faith in God afterward. In 1 Samuel 17:11 when Goliath made his challenge, Saul was terrified instead of trusting, showing he hadn't really repented.
 - In Exodus 10:16 because God had plagued the Egyptians with locusts, Pharaoh told Moses and Aaron, "I have sinned against the Lord your God." But once the plague was gone, he didn't let the Israelites leave Egypt, showing he hadn't really repented.
 - In 2 Samuel 12:7-13 when Nathan confronted King David with taking the wife of Uriah, the Hittite, to be his own and then arranging for Uriah to be killed, David said, "I have sinned against the Lord." Nathan replied, "The Lord has taken away your sin. You aren't going to die." Why did God forgive David? Because he knew David's heart and he knew David had repented.
 - Let us confess and repent as soon as we become aware of our sin.
