Dear Siblings in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen

I pray this grace and peace to you in yet another time of tragedy for our nation and world. As I sit down to write this letter for our June newsletter, I'm hearing the news that at least two are dead in Uvalde, TX. At least nine... Fourteen... Eighteen... and last I checked the news, nineteen children and two adults. Killed by violence in a hometown brought on by what? Hate? Intolerance? Bullying? Retaliation? Mental illness? You know what, it doesn't matter what. There is no reason for the loss of life and suffering that has occurred.

We can talk about gun rights. We can talk about "catching" the signs of someone about to go off the deep end. We can talk about any number of ways to prevent such tragedy. We can, as they say on the news, send our "thoughts and prayers" to the families affected. But, you know what? This is not the only mass shooting of this type in the last month. Churches, grocery stores, schools... are not safe. This is sometimes and especially true for our neighbors of color. And we are all affected.

We can no longer send sympathies far away and make ourselves feel safer by saying what a disaster this has been for "those people." We ARE those people. The prevalence of this violence in our country has taught us that this can happen anywhere, to anyone, even to the most innocent among us. I wish we had answers for fixing the problem - and quickly, I sure do. But, I don't have the answers, not by myself, and I expect you don't either, not alone. But, for the sake of one another, we MUST, as a nation, do better.

So, Church, we pray that God shows us the way. We must draw our hope from the Lord. We must pray for the new heaven and the new earth where God comes to dwell among us, where God will wipe away our tears and stop death. As resurrection people we believe God can do this.

But, praying is not enough. We, the Body of Christ, are the hands and feet and hearts and voices of the Lord in the world here and now. We must lead with love, going into the places where pain and trauma are present. Jesus shows us the way, all the way to the cross.

We must, wherever we go, wherever we are, put a stop to the hate we see around us—speak out against talk and action that hurts our neighbors. We must lead with love and understanding. We must bring compassion into the hurting corners of the world. We must stand up and against that which divides us and stand for that which unites us. We must love in all our thoughts, words and deeds. Love for Jesus is not simply emotion, but ACTION: Acts of service, deeds of love, advocacy, truth-speaking, reconciliation... hard work.

God unites us in love. God loves ALL of us. Only love can win a battle with hate, with sin, with death, with evil. **Let us not just pray about the news, but be the love that changes the news.** This is why we exist, dear Church, to be Christ in the world—making a difference.

I pray the hope you have in the Lord and in the power of God's love comfort you in this time of sorrow, and

that it empower you to bring about the change in our society that Jesus' love calls for.

Every little thing we do matters. And the way you love makes a difference.

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP - What is means and is it for you? Trinity Lutheran is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), regionally of the ELCA's Lower Susquehanna Synod, and locally of the LSS's Hanover Conference. The congregation operates under a Constitution that has been adopted and ratified by the congregation, the synod office, and thereby by the ELCA. Membership within the congregation means you're offered the opportunity to serve as an individual with both voice and vote in business decisions at congregational meetings, serve as a member of the congregation's council (governing board), and reap the benefits of things like using the church facilities without a rental fee. Membership also comes with responsibility: regular use of the means of grace (God's Word and Sacraments), live a Christian life in accordance with Christ's teachings, and support the work of the Church in all its forms. Once a member, your membership is defined by our constitution as someone who makes a contribution of record (time, talent, or finance) and communes at least annually. EVERYONE IS ALWAYS WELCOME to participate in worship, Christian education, ministry committees and other service opportunities, the sacraments, pastoral care, fellowship, and other aspects of our shared life of faith regardless of membership. COMING THIS FALL - BIBLICAL STORYTELLING

Want to become more familiar with the Bible? Interested in learning more about the passages we read in worship? Love serving as a Reader (lector) in church and wish you could expand on those readings? Here's a great chance! Biblical Storytelling is a method of proclaiming Scripture that involves becoming familiar with a passage and then telling the story to others. There's a general goal of 75% accuracy in repeating the words of the passage and 95% accuracy in sharing the content or message of the passage. YOU can do this! This is particularly a great way to share the stories of Scripture if you're not comfortable reading out loud - you get to tell the story in your own words.

Here are some tips on how to become a Biblical Storyteller:

- *Pick a passage of Scripture that you'd like to share (The list of fall options can be found on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex.)
- *Know your passage well enough to tell it, not read it. Study its context. Set the scene by describing it and introducing the characters.
- *Pace yourself. Don't rush through the story, tell it at a natural pace with your normal voice. Speak clearly so you can be heard.
- *Use props and other visuals if they'll help.
- *Figure out how you'll enlist the help of others if it's appropriate.
- *Practice, practice, practice. Practice alone, in front of the mirror, and in front of people.



If you'd like to be a Biblical Storyteller this fall during worship, September 11 - November 20, check out the list of lectionary passages on the sign-up sheet on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex. See

Pastor Susan with any questions or to learn more. The Storyteller will serve to tell the story during the worship time and will act in the place of the Lector for that particular passage. If no Storyteller signs up, then the Lector's job remains the same as always.

THE JOSÉ PROJECT

Trinity's Commitment to Stewardship, Discipleship, Loving and Serving God and Neighbors May 2022

Who: José is an 18 year old high school senior caring for his sister and brother

because their mother basically abandoned them. They are living by themselves while attending school.

What: This family of siblings needs a safe place to live and support along the way in order to lead productive and independent lives. The high school teachers became aware of the situation and took action and organized support. They contacted Trinity. We answered! A high school teacher's family had an old trailer they were willing to rent to José at a very low cost. To meet their needs, we are concentrating on two concurrent phases: Phase A--Rehabilitation of a dilapidated trailer to provide a safe and reliable place for these siblings to live. Phase B—Teaching these teenagers life skills to allow them to lead independent, productive, and meaningful lives.

Helpers: All aspects of the entire project are being overseen by the high school teaching team. The trailer rehab is being overseen by Trinity's Mission in Motion ministry and Servants Inc., a Red Lion based Christian organization committed to helping low-income homeowners with building and repairs. To date, at least 13 individuals have contributed over 254 hours rehabbing the trailer. Servants Inc. is managing the roof repair while Trinity is managing the interior as well as windows, doors and utility connections.

Funds and Materials Raised So far:

- \$1000 from Trinity's Mission In Motion budget began the fund raising.
- \$2000 from Trinity's Endowment Fund contributed to the fund raising.
- \$1600+ was raised in a school district fund raiser.
- \$5275 was collected on a Go Fund Me page initiated by a teach-

- er at the high school.
- \$2753 has been contributed from 3 other churches local churches: Red Run, Holy Trinity in York Springs, and Harmony Church of God.
- \$859 worth of supplies was contributed by Exeter Supply Co., York.
- \$2050 has been donated by at least 15 other individuals.
- Servants from Red Lion has donated supplies and is taking care of the trailer roof.
- Four Square Church in York Springs has committed to purchasing an apartment size washer/dryer.
- A community member is installing the heat/ac at a much discounted rate.
- The Lion's Club supplied eyeglasses for José.
- The Center for Traffic Safety contributed funds for José's driver's ed.
- The Salvation Army is paying the first 2 months rent.
- York Springs UMC Church is paying the rent for 4 months.
- Numerous church members and community members are contributing household furnishings.
- Lowe's of Hanover has partnered with Trinity to provide building materials at a much discounted rate.
- A community member has organized a meal donation for these siblings until they can learn to cook for themselves in their new home.
 - ♦ 13 Trinity members have volunteered to contribute a meal so far.
 - At least 6 Trinity members have donated money towards meals.

José earned his driver's license on May 19 and he graduates on May 27. He will then begin working full time as a school district custodian. We have enough funds to purchase an inexpensive but reliable used car for him. We hope the siblings will be able to move into their new home mid-June. Then the cooking lessons will begin!





Meeting Minutes

Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes May 12, 2022

Present: Pastor Susan McCarthy, Bob King, Dona Lerew, Sue Clauser, Rick Madsen, Jay Smith, Mark Boyer, Sherry Brown, and Karen Sheaffer and joining via Zoom, Katharine Beckman Lisa Miller. Absent-Stephanie Haley

Bob called the meeting to order and Pastor Susan used our Council Meeting Liturgy, reading from John 20:19-23. Our agenda was reviewed and one item was added under Hybrid Church: we need to set a meeting date to review the committee's report.

Secretary's Report-the written report was reviewed and Mark made a motion to approve, Sherry seconded the motion, all agreed and the motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report-</u>the report was reviewed and more information is in the Finance Committe Report.

Ministry Reports

Learning & Youth-Lisa reported no meeting was held since our last council meeting. The youth will be baking bread after the Children's Sermon on Sunday, to be used during the intergenerational learning event on the sacrament, during the Sunday School hour. Worship & Music-the committee met on and reviewed the Easter services and then finalized plans for Pastor Susan's Installation Service on May 22. We also plan on having one outdoor service each month this summer. The dates are June 19, July 3, and August 28.

Finance-Committee did not schedule a meeting at our April meeting for the month of May. It was decided that if a meeting was needed one would be called at that time. The Audit Team is currently in process of finalizing their written report and will meet later this month to review and sign off on the report. A Finance Committee meeting will be scheduled for Monday, June 6 at 7:00 p.m. April Financial Results

Total budgeted receipts (Current and Synod Benevolence) for April were \$16,934 and budgeted expenses \$17,249 for a monthly deficit of \$314. Current April budgeted receipts were \$16,089 against a budget of \$15,929. While we did slightly exceed our current

budget for April, YTD we are still \$7,842 behind our target. YTD Synod Benevolence is also a bit short by \$773 against a YTD budget of \$4,087. Total budgeted income vs. expenses were \$63,221 vs. \$65,935 for a deficit \$2,714. Overall, our budgeted income is \$8,565 below our YTD target but expenses to date are also under budget by \$4,123. June/July are heavy expense months as our HVAC service contract and insurance premiums fall due in these periods.

Parish Life-This committee is organizing food and fellowship for the following dates: May 15, Intergenerational Communion and Faith Formation Class snacks; Prayer workshop; May 22, Sunday School Celebration, meal for Pastor's Installation; June 5, Spring Fling, June 26, Katherine's last day send off.

Social Ministry-The Next Food Pantry will be held Wednesday, June 1 from 4:00-6:00pm.

Our Next Laundry Love date is Tuesday, June 14 from 5:30-6:30pm at the White Dove Laundromat. Please note that we are still collecting quarters!

Ruth's Harvest Packing continues Tuesday, May 17 at 1:00pm at St. John's in Abbottstown.

WELCA: We met on Tuesday, May 3 and Anna Mae Foreman was our guest speaker. She shared her knowledge of butterflies and their life cycle. She also shared how to attract butterflies and birds to your backyard and gardens. Everyone enjoyed her visit! We also assembled the Spring-Cleaning Buckets that were handed out at Wednesday's Food Pantry. A Thrivent Action Team \$250 gift card was used to purchase the items!

Our Shoo Fly and Cherry Pie sale was a huge event, and we made over 140 pies. Thank you to everyone who helped and purchased pies.
