**DB's Dabblings:** "Dealing with the Stress of the Storm"

Stress is part of our lives, it is part of our work, home, and even our private endeavors, but overwhelming stress can hurt our productivity, our relationships, our health, and even our faith. There is a story of Jesus in Mark 4 that illustrates this. Jesus has finished a long hard day of ministry with the sick and the poor, so he and his apostles get in a boat and head out across the lake away from the stress. Jesus quickly falls asleep on a cushion in the boat, and while he is sleeping a fierce storm comes up and the wind, rain and waves cause the boat to fill with water. The more sea-experienced apostles know immediately what to do and call out orders to lower the sails and start bailing water. Then they find that Jesus is still asleep in the middle of the storm. Their reaction to Jesus shows their stress level. "Teacher, don't you care that we are perishing?" Their stress has caused them to not only be afraid in the storm, but to also be angry with Jesus for not helping to keep the boat from sinking. They question his motives as to whether he really cares for their safety, and at that moment they have no faith in his miraculous power. Jesus calms the storm in his mighty power and addresses their fear and lack of faith. But the apostles, instead of being overwhelmed with thanksgiving and praise for their salvation from the storm, are overwhelmed with fear of his power and authority over the storm, probably in part because of the uncertainty about their relationship with him due to how they spoke to him in their stress induced fear and anger.

This story illustrates how stress can create greater anxiety, negate our work efforts, cause us to communicate poorly and develop atmospheres of negativity and judgement that hurt our relationships. While there are many helpful practices that will help us better cope with stress than the apostles did in this example, the baseline for this situation is the need for faith. Our faith is very helpful in moments of overwhelming stress. Jesus said to the apostles, "Why are you so afraid? Are you still struggling to believe?" While one's level of faith is very personal, it is universally understood that personal faith is helpful to coping with stress, and the more grounded our faith, the more it will be a resource in dealing with the stressors of life.

Let us pray. Father God, and our Lord Jesus Christ, we come to you asking that you give us in this day, greater faith as we face the stresses it brings. May our hearts and minds be open to your Holy Spirit within us as we try to be calm healing agents in the storm. In Jesus name, Amen.


