The Most Holy Trinity – 12th June 2022

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your death gave life to the world, free by this, your most holy body and blood from all my sins and from every evil, keep me always faithful to your commandments and never let me be parted from you.

This is the ninth century prayer which the priest says quietly after the Lamb of God at Mass. I thought I would share it with you this Sunday as starting point for this reflection on the Trinity.

The prayer reminds us that the mystery of the Holy Trinity is *dynamic* not *static*. There is an understanding of God, particularly popular in the eighteenth century, known as "deism", in which God created the world, left us to it, and when we die will punish the wicked and reward the just. It's easy to see how, especially when we are struggling and our vision is clouded, it might feel like that – that God is remote and uncaring. And so Jesus and the Scriptures reveal to us that God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, are rather a communion of persons who continually work together so that we might have life.

The first reading this Sunday offers a rather lovely image of Wisdom (God) delighting at play in his creation and among his people. One of the warming experiences of emerging from lockdown was hearing children back in the playground, at first in small numbers and finally this year in full force. Those who write about the importance of play speak of its role in enabling us to imagine "alternative possible futures". Play enables us to be – even if only for a short while – other than we are in our usual roles. It is a necessary part of our growth in virtue and remains so even when we are adults.

If you pay attention to the structure of most of the prayers of the Mass (and especially the Eucharistic Prayer) you will see that they are directed *to* the Father, *through* the Son, *in the unity* of the Holy Spirit. Indeed, we might like to think about the liturgy as an arena of divine play, in which we enter into alternative possible realities and are supported in our growth and change. (Yes, it has certain structures and forms and might not feel like play until we become familiar with it, but so do dance, music, comedy and even childrens' games.)

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; bthe God who is, who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father.
