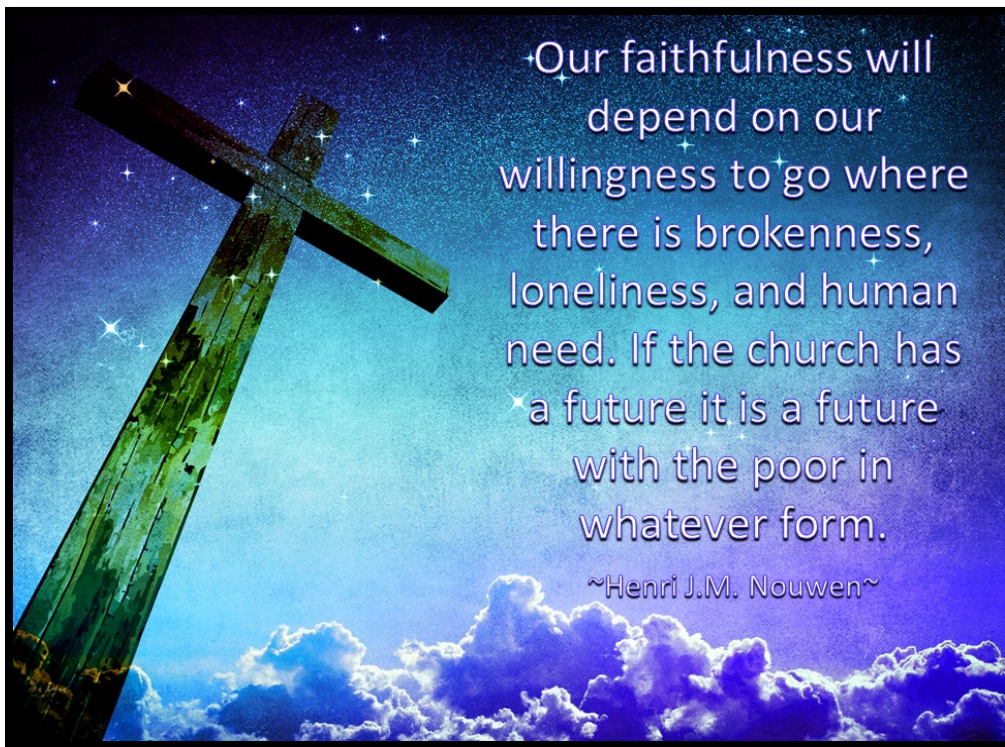

Prayer Vigil for the Victims of Local Mass Shooting (and national shootings):

Sunday, June 12th (TODAY) at 2:00 pm at Shiloh United Methodist Church located at 19731 Shiloh Church Rd., Hagerstown, MD.



The national crisis of mass shootings has hit home with a shooting at Valley Mall on Wednesday and a tragic mass shooting yesterday that resulted in the loss of three lives as well as the wounding of two others. Members of Shiloh United Methodist Church and Trinity Lutheran Church in Smithsburg have been directly affected by these shootings, as have numerous people in our community. The fabric of our community as a whole is affected as well by the local loss, and fear and frustration that these tragedies occur weekly throughout our country. Shiloh United Methodist Church and HARC invite clergy, people of faith and the community at large to join together to mourn those who were killed in this violence - Mark Alan Frey, Joshua Robert Wallace, and Charles Edward Minnick Jr. - to offer prayers and support the families and friends of the victims as well as those wounded and still with us, and to pray for healing for our community and country.

The daily COVID positivity rate in Washington County is currently 8.89% as of June 9th per the Washington County Health Department and the 7-day average as reported by Meritus Health is 11.6% as of June 6th. 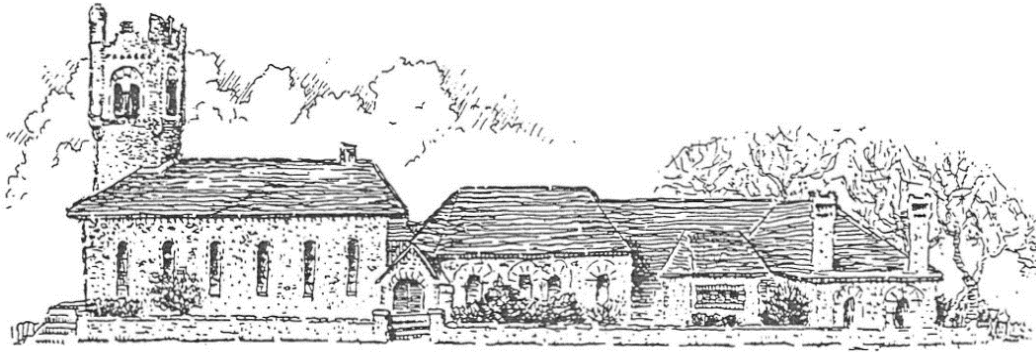
