DB's Dabblings: "Thinking About Father's Day"

"Listen, my son, to your father's instruction, and do not forsake your mother's teaching." (Proverbs 1:8)

For some reason I have been thinking a lot more about my father this Father's Day than the others that have passed since his death. There may be some simple reasons for that. I have been involved in the lives of some friends that are also dealing with the deaths of their fathers lately. Also, I have been dealing with some things with my mother lately that has caused me to think about what Dad would wish for the situation. But there are some things that have happened lately that seem to go beyond that.

For example, I was trying to fix a broken piece on my yard trimer, and I realized I was trying to put it on backwards, and I could hear my dad's voice in my mind laughing and telling me "It will never work like that." Or, I was trying to cut a board to make a shelf in Vicki's kitchen pantry and I was needing to notch it for the post to run through the corner. I almost cut it upside down, which would have made it notched on the wrong side of the shelf. And I pictured Dad sitting at the kitchen counter sketching out on paper with his carpenter's pencil exactly how the pieces needed to fit together before he made any cuts with the saw.

Now, to understand why these come to mind so clearly for me, you need to realize my dad was a mechanic in his real job, and a wood worker in his fun job! He tried to teach me a few things, but I am not naturally the most mechanically minded person to easily learn, and my dad also found it to save a lot of time to only try to show once, and then do it yourself. Although he was sometimes impatient, maybe more than sometimes, he never quit trying to teach me. And even now, he is still teaching me.

So, dads, this Father's Day, remember your words and efforts to teach your children are not wasted, they live long after you say them. Patience goes a long way in the training process, but even when you've been a little impatient, but still in love, your efforts will be appreciated, even after you're gone.

Here is a reprint of a recent letter received by our Prison Ministry:

I am currently enrolled in 23 Bible Studies. Over the last year, I've learned so much about myself and God's love for me. After losing both of my parents, I felt I was no one's daughter anymore. I know now that is just what Satan wanted me to believe. I have a heavenly Father that loves me and wil never leave me. This I truly with all my heart believe.

I continue to do your Bible Study because it teaches me to be a better parent. My children are grown now and I was not a good mom. I was abused as a young child and when I hade my youngest, I was raped while pregnant with her. Then I suffered through post-partum depression and PTSD. Unfortunately, my life took a turn for the worse which my choice, bad as they were, brought me to prison.

My daughters have both reached out to me and we are rebuilding our broken family with God as the head of our household. Your Bible Studies have helped me to understand the way parents and children behave and how their behavior can effect our lives so drastically.

Last week, I became a grandma. I have been sharing with my daughters all I have learned and it has helped me to recognize where my parents went wrong and where I went wrong. Together, we are trusting in God now.

Thank you for sending the Bible and Bible Studies to me. It is greatly appreciated and is making a big difference in my life and I hope, for others as well.


