## Corpus Christi – 19th June 2022

I spent five days over the half term week on a rock-climbing course at the National Outdoor Centre in North Wales. I was looking forward to spending some quality time on rock and getting some really good coaching on my climbing skills. The week did not disappoint – even if I didn't becoming a 'climbing god' by the end of the week.

One of the things that I came across in that week was the idea of "islands of safety". One of the features of traditional rock climbing (the sort that I like to do) is that it can be quite scary. The challenges are more often managing the risk of falling and the perception of that risk than any really big physical moves. One of the ways of making progress up a rock face, or through steep a mountain environment is to create "islands of safety" – places which are well protected (objectively safe) and feel secure (subjectively safe) – and to look at the climb as moving from one of those to another. It breaks the problem down into manageable chunks and provides respite from the intensity of the more difficult or exposed sections.

It struck me that idea also holds good for our personal and spiritual lives. Life can be quite scary, not the least when there is war in Europe, economic distress, remaining uncertainty about the progress and impact of a pandemic, and uncertainty as to what a life of faith might look like in the years ahead. We need times and places which are islands of safety in our lives.

The Eucharist is the Lord's gift to us as an island of safety. Each Sunday we are summoned by the Lord to be with him in his very self and fed by his very self. We are summoned not only to receive but also to minister this outward and visible sign to one another. The gathering of the body of Christ which is the church underlines and supports our sense of the presence of the body of Christ in the sacrament of his body and blood. And the sacrament renews the church in return.

As we adapt to slightly different patterns after a pandemic I invite and encourage you to value your presence at the Sunday Eucharist, not only as a place in which you are fed and nourished, but also as a place in which others are encouraged and supported by your presence. You might not always feel that we get much out of Mass, but your personal presence is part of those outward and visible signs which mediate the Lord's presence and makes of the Mass a place of respite and safety in the journey through life.
