- Lord our God, do give us understanding and draw us closer to you as we proceed together through the new sermon series on the Ten Commandments.

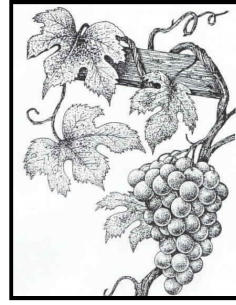
