Mission Memo ... Pray for Church Workers Around the World & in our Community

Rev. James and Deaconess Christel Neuendorf, missionaries in Puerto Rico were supported by Christ Lutheran Big Mission Event in 2013. They share how they see members reaching out to the community. An autistic little girl walks up to people and holds their hand. Her mother says that Angela clearly understands that people at her church are a part of her family. We learn that we can be the hands and feet of God's children as we walk with them and show them to other members of the family of God at our church. Christel spent two days at a deaconess gathering in the Dominican Republic. She got to see what God has done in His church and with His people. Missionary Ashley Lehr led a Concordia Mission team. Members were grateful for the students and professors who painted and fixed up the grounds of Fuente de Vida. Their deco design brought life to the church campus. Thank God for evangelism walks and daily activities in the Mercy House.

CHRISTMAS IN JULY

** ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN CHRISTMAS GIFT BOXES - Amazing! That sums up last summer's Orphan Grain Train Christmas Box project. At the end of our project last year 1,902 Christmas boxes were ready to be delivered to Orphan Grain Train, all packed with donations collected last summer. Over that previous three years we have sent 4,161 boxes to children around the world who rarely receive any gifts. Some do not own anything other than the clothes on their back. Some do not know the Christmas story.

Our goal this year is to share another 2,000 gift boxes through Orphan Grain Train so even more children can hear the Christmas story. You can help us fill these boxes using monetary gifts or donations of clothes and toys. Each box contains a t-shirt, socks, underwear, coloring book, stickers, crayons, ball, toothbrush, stuffed animal, and toy. The boxes are for children ages 2 to 12. We are collecting new underwear, new socks, 24 count boxes of crayons, coloring books, pages of stickers, plastic and rubber balls, and toothbrushes in individual packages. Used items to be donated include t-shirts, stuffed animals, and toys including dolls, Barbies, blocks (Legos, Duplos, wooden), baseball gloves, and children's puzzles.

Take a tag from the Christmas in July tree and return the items to the tree. Any used items to be donated may also be placed under the tree. Monetary donations (marked "Grace Lutheran Christmas Box Project") can be sent to Grace Lutheran Church or Orphan Grain Train, Norfolk, NE. We are collecting donations through July 31. If you have any questions or would like to help pack the boxes, contact Kelly Asbury at 402-371-3521. You can help these children know they are precious and that Jesus is the greatest gift of all!
