



FALL ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS

Have you ever wondered what will Heaven be like? Or what the Bible says about Heaven? The Adult Sunday School class will start back up on Sunday, **September 18th** at 9:00 a.m. after a summer break and we will be doing a study about Heaven. The primary book we will use is "The Case for Heaven" by Lee Strobel. Lee Strobel is an investigative author who applies his research and analytical skills to show definitive evidence for the existence of heaven. We also will use a supplemental book from a "Touchpoints series" called "Heaven" by Randy Alcorn. It is a small purple

and gold book that has lots of Bible references regarding Heaven. If you plan to participate in this class, you don't have to purchase the books as we will have study guides to help in this study.

This topic will dovetail nicely with our past study of Daniel and Revelation, but you can still participate if you missed those. We will offer a virtual attendance option through Zoom if you are not comfortable meeting in person. This should be a very interesting study that should elicit some rich discussions! Come join us!

Make a scene with this fun summer craft you can create outdoors.




- Play sand
- Spoons
- Empty jars
- · Powdered tempera paint
- · Cardstock paper and pencil
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush —



What you do:

- Pour a few tablespoons of sand into empty jars. (You need one jar for every color of paint you make.)
- Add a small amount of powdered paint to the sand and then mix. Experiment with the amount, using more paint to create deeper colors.
- Lightly sketch a design on cardstock.
- 4. Working in one small section at a time, paint an even layer of craft glue on the paper.
- Use a spoon to sprinkle colored sand atop the glue. Tilt the paper so extra sand falls off. Repeat to complete the entire design.
- 6. Let dry on a flat surface before displaying upright.
