Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 26th June 2022

Once the hand is laid on the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.

I have to confess that I have never ploughed a field, but I think we are supposed to think that looking back is not a good thing to do, that maybe it causes you to go off-line. This saying of Jesus was really important for me in my twenties. As a teenager I had wondered whether to become a teacher (maths or physics would have been my subjects) or to explore a vocation to priesthood. I went from university to seminary and was ordained priest just before my 26th birthday. (Some of my later students at Wonersh thought that was a *very* young age to be ordained.) During those years of formation and discernment I would sometimes wonder whether I should leave and get some other experience, perhaps by teaching for a few years, but it was this very phrase from today's Gospel that kept coming back to me and helped me to trust that the Lord knew what he was doing in leading me along this way without regret.

There is something very human about what is sometimes called 'counterfactual thinking' – wondering, or spending too much time and energy worrying, about how things might otherwise have been. What if I had done X or Y instead? What if P had happened instead of Q? This way of thinking may sometimes be helpful in reviewing serious incidents, but I am not sure that it is helpful to our day-to-day wellbeing and our spiritual lives.

I remember Archbishop Kevin MacDonald, when he came to Southwark, asking 'What was the best time to be Catholic?' and suggesting to us that *now* was the best time, because it was the time that had been given to us. A pandemic, a war in Europe, a waning of faith and a political and economic crisis are not things that we would choose but they are the context in which *we* are called to follow the Lord and bear witness to what *we* have received. There is no time in history in which the life of faith has been without its challenges. Those who were Catholic here in the early modern period were fined into submission. Those who might have celebrated Mass were arrested and imprisoned, as were those who sheltered them. Many others later were to be migrants, penniless and poor and far from their homeland. Their faith, like that of the psalmist, was based on their sense that God was with them now and that they need only look to him to be safe, secure and ultimately full of joy. In challenging times we too need to run the race that God has given us, with our eyes fixed on Jesus.
