The Importance of The Book of Daniel



Why Should We Study Prophecy?

1. It gives the clearest and most conclusive evidence, that the Bible is the inspired and infallible Word of God.

2. If it is neglected then man is ignorant of God's plan and the future and man becomes the easy prey of lying inventions and delusive theories.

3. All the present evil conditions, the denial of the faith, the indifference and worldliness of professing Christians are the result of ignoring Prophecy.

Nebuchadnezzar

Babylon

Besieged

Eighteenth king of the Kingdom of Judah. Made king by Pharoah-nechoh of Egypt (2 Kings 23:34-24:1; 2 Chronicles 36:4-7).

King of Babylon. Conquerer of Egypt and *known* world.

Also known as Chaldea.

Surrounded.

How Did Jehoiakim and Jerusalem come to be surrounded by Nebuchadnezzar?


The concise answer:

God made a covenant with Israel and they broke it.





Covenant = An agreement or promise



An Unconditional covenant, meaning God would not break it. But Israel did and would face judgment for disobeying God and forsaking His promise to them.




