Dear Siblings in Christ,

I must confess, sometimes when I'm prepping my part of the newsletter I start and stop and start before settling on a topic or scripture to write about. This happened, with added pressure since this is a two-month edition, this time around and as a result while Snapchatting with my nephew and his fiancé I wrote, "I'm struggling with my newsletter article. Need inspiration."

Brittany, our soon-to-be-newest family member (No insult to our brand new great nephew Beckett's position as newest member; they're different categories after all.), sent back a photo of her dinner, labeled "Inspiration." It was a piece of pepperoni pizza. If I made a guess, I'd think it came from Sam's Club, which is across the parking lot from the Walmart where she's an assistant manager. It's pretty good, pretty convenient, and pretty cheap. She's made of the stuff. I would be too if I worked there.

That piece of pizza instantly became a wondrous inspiration for me—my message, and God's, for us is to eat more pizza! Heck, put pepperoni on it if you like! Why? Because we need it.

I'm not talking about actual pizza, though it's mighty good. I invite you to follow my metaphor into the realm of spiritual pizza. David, the psalmist, is writing from the wilderness where he's seeking the Lord with a "thirsty" soul (v.1). He calls God's love better than life (v.3) and once meditating on the Lord (v.6) his soul "is satisfied as with a rich feast" (v.5).

Don't we, too, hunger and thirst for the Lord's embrace? Don't we seek something always to bolster our days and nights when the troubles of this world weigh us down? Don't we sometimes suffer from doubt, depression, anxiety, physical ailments, stress, wondering... the list goes on. And wouldn't a feast that's easy to get, doesn't cost

much, and tastes great be a marvelous respite from the heavy load? Like a piece of pizza from Sam's Club after a busy work week? With pepperoni to boot?

We hunger for God's presence with us throughout this journey called life and there's nothing wrong with satisfying that hunger with what nourishes your soul: prayer, scripture, music, holy communion, worship, staying home from worship, the woods, the beach, laughing with friends, engaging in service to others, giving to the church or a project or a ministry... that list also goes on. Sometimes we just need a piece of spiritual pizza.

David, in the psalm, and the living Christ, remind us that we are not called to a diet of fasting all the time. We American Lutherans can be a pretty stoic bunch, believing that our own needs can only be met by self-sacrifice. And, there's a time and place for those sorts of observances. But, I want to remind us all that it's okay to indulge in the pizza too.

What nourishes your soul? What do you need right now to enhance your walk of faith? Your discipleship? Your relationship with God and with others in faithful community? Brittany's goofy response to my need for inspiration has prompted me to ask myself these questions and to think of genuine answers:

- Time in the woods
- ♦ Time alone
- ♦ A good fictional read
- Some new recipes to feed my family
- ♦ A good drama
- ♦ Deep scriptural study
- ♦ Time with colleagues
- ♦ Silence
- ♦ Laughter

WELCA News

No matter, we had a wonderful time and enjoyed the covered dishes everyone brought to share. We voted to pay Trinity's \$300 contribution for the second half of the year to our local Food Pantry.

WELCA does not meet during July and August. Our next meeting will be September 6 at 5:30, and we will try again to enjoy Janet McMaster's gardens when she hosts us for a picnic. All women of Trinity are welcome and encouraged to attend! Later that week, on Thursday and Friday, we will be baking pies for Trinity's bake table for the East Berlin's Fall Festival. We plan on having a variety of pies to choose from.

Wellness Group

We met on June 31 at the Church Schoolhouse in the East Berlin Cemetery for a look inside and to learn the history of the first school in East Berlin. Owned by the Union Cemetery Association (Trinity Lutheran and Zwingli UCC) and maintained by the East Berlin Historical Preservation Society, the school was started by our early church members to teach the Bible and other religious studies. Later, public school classes were held there in various forms until 1930. The building was also used for meetings of our town's organizations including the Berlin Improvement Society (an early library to teach German residents to read English), and the Berlin Beneficial Society, which helped residents in need of help. Today, the Historical Society's Education Program uses the building for local schools' field trips.

Those attending this meeting, were able to write with a quill pen, use a slate board and slate pencil to do a math problem, and seal a letter shut with hot wax and a brass seal.

We are hoping to schedule another visit to this wonderful East Berlin treasure, as many were not able to attend our June meeting date.

<u>Finance</u>

At the Annual Congregational Meeting November 2021, Trinity adopted a budget totaling \$219,579. To meet this budget required an increase in giving levels and we highlighted that requirement in a letter to the congregation in January 2022. As we examine our financial position through May we are falling way short of our budgeted requirements for giving. What's even more concerning is that giving levels for current (operating expenses) are below 2021 levels by \$6,328.

Through May we are \$14,641 short in meeting our current budget requirements (operating expenses) and \$1038 short in meeting our Synod Commitment. While total operating expenses are below budget, we are not currently meeting expenses and have an operating deficit of \$5,476. Like everyone we are feeling the impact of higher costs (especially utilities) but our present rate of giving is below what is needed to sustain our ministries. Funds available to meet operating expenses on

May 31, 2022 are \$22,576. June & July are heavy expense months due to insurance premiums and maintenance/service contracts that fall due in these periods. The Finance Committee feels the need to raise awareness of the reality of the current trend and the importance in meeting our budgeted giving commitment.

We all must make sacrifices during these financially trying times. The church is no exception. We must look at ways to reduce costs but, must all do our part in prayerfully increasing our giving to sustain our active ministries.

Are you creative? Would you like to help us welcome guests who attend our weekly service? Then please consider helping us to make Visitor Gift Bags. A handout with additional details is available on the counter in the Narthex. There is also a sign-up sheet on the counter—if you'd like to help, please sign your name to cover a month of this calendar year. If you have any questions, please contact Ali Long.

KNOTTY KNOTTERS: The Knotty Knotters make and distribute quilts to

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP - What it means and is it for you? Trinity Lutheran is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), regionally of the ELCA's Lower Susquehanna Synod, and locally of the LSS's Hanover Conference. The congregation operates under a Constitution that has been adopted and ratified by the congregation, the synod office, and thereby by the ELCA. Membership within the congregation means you're offered the opportunity to serve as an individual with both voice and vote in business decisions at congregational meetings, serve as a member of the congregation's council (governing board), and reap the benefits of things like using the church facilities without a rental fee. Membership also comes with responsibility: regular use of the means of grace (God's Word and Sacraments), live a Christian life in accordance with Christ's teachings, and support the work of the Church in all its forms. Once a member, your membership is defined by our constitution as someone who makes a contribution of record (time, talent, or finance) and communes at least annually. EVERYONE IS ALWAYS WELCOME to participate in worship, Christian education, ministry committees and other service opportunities, the sacraments, pastoral care, fellowship, and other aspects of our shared life of faith regardless of membership. COMING THIS FALL - BIBLICAL STORYTELLING

Want to become more familiar with the Bible? Interested in learning more about the passages we read in worship? Love serving as a Reader (lector) in church and wish you could expand on those readings? Here's a great chance! Biblical Storytelling is a method of proclaiming Scripture that involves becoming familiar with a passage and then telling the story to others. There's a general goal of 75% accuracy in repeating the words of the passage and 95% accuracy in sharing the content or message of the passage. YOU can do this! This is particularly a great way to share the stories of Scripture if you're not comfortable reading out loud - you get to tell the story in your own words.

Here are some tips on how to become a Biblical Storyteller:

- *Pick a passage of Scripture that you'd like to share (The list of fall options can be found on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex.)
- *Know your passage well enough to tell it, not read it. Study its context. Set the scene by describing it and introducing the characters.
- *Pace yourself. Don't rush through the story, tell it at a natural pace with your normal voice. Speak clearly so you can be heard.
- *Use props and other visuals if they'll help.
- *Figure out how you'll enlist the help of others if it's appropriate.
- *Practice, practice, practice. Practice alone, in front of the mirror, and in front of people.



If you'd like to be a Biblical Storyteller this fall during worship, September 11 - November 20, check out the list of lectionary passages on the sign-up sheet on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex. See

Pastor Susan with any questions or to learn more. The Storyteller will serve to tell the story during the worship time and will act in the place of the Lector for that particular passage. If no Storyteller signs up, then the Lector's job remains the same as always.



Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes June 9, 2022

Present: Pastor Susan McCarthy, Bob King, Dona Lerew, Sue Clauser, Stephanie Haley, Rick Madsen, Jay Smith, Mark Boyer, Sherry Brown, Karen Sheaffer, Katharine Beckman and Lisa Miller.

Bob called the meeting to order and our Intern Katharine Beckman used our Council Meeting Liturgy, reading from John 12-15. She then offered us Holy Communion.

Our agenda was reviewed and three items were added under Old Business: July council meeting conflicts with Vacation Bible School, VBS contribution from Trinity, and a report on our Intern, Katharine Beckman.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>-the written report was reviewed and was approved as written.

<u>Treasurer's Report-</u>the report was reviewed and discussion began on our giving from the congregation is below last year to date and the cost of our utilities have increased this year. More information is in the Finance Committee Report.

Ministry Reports

Learning & Youth-Lisa reported their next meeting has to be rescheduled due to Vacation Bible School and is now scheduled for July 11. The VBS registration form was shared via email. July's meeting will include planning for the remaining year's events.

Worship & Music-Our meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 7.

Finance-Meeting held Monday, June 6.

Review of May Financial Results-Results are disappointing and of concern. Through May, we are short \$15,679 from our budgeted giving. Even with reduced expenses thus far in 2022 we are currently not meeting expenses and have an operating deficit of \$5,476. YTD 2022 giving for "Current" is behind 2021 by \$6,328. June and July are heavy expense months so unless the current trend changes, we will experience an increase in the deficit. We need to understand why this is occurring, so Bob is going to request Jen to do a summary analysis of giving units and giving allocations to determine if there are patterns of persons reducing giving or no

longer giving at all. Pastor will also be preparing an announcement during the offering, and we want our giving results to appear in every bulletin. It is sometimes omitted due to space considerations. Discussion ensued about what we will do if this trend continues. Bob reported that Memorial funds of \$22,694 of the total \$25,694 are undesignated. \$3000 of Memorial funds from Ralph and Judy Burgard has been designated for kitchen equipment. Bob indicated we would not use any Memorial Funds for current expenses without first holding a congregational meeting. Constitutionally, we are not required to do so for undesignated memorial funds, but when addressed at a congregational meeting we are fully transparent in disclosing our financial position.

Audit Findings

Other than a few minor adjustments for unposted interest, the reconciliation of our balance sheet values at 12/31/2021 fairly represents our financial position at that date. An internal control issue was discovered in our random selection of paid invoices. Invoices paid for Met Ed and Comcast are paid electronically and have not received the appropriate check request forms and approvals as dictated by policy. The same exists for payroll and Portico benefits. After discussion, since staff salaries and benefits are approved by Council and the Congregation those expenses will not require check request forms and approvals. All other payments including billings for services that are done electronically must be printed and submitted to Jen for standard check request processing and subsequent approval. The final audit report will now be prepared for Audit Committee approval and submission to Council for approval.

Project Jose Income and Expenditures

A spreadsheet containing all income and expenditures for Project Jose' was reviewed by the committee. Since donations of cash and other equipment and services have been provided from multiple sources it is extremely important to make sure all donations and expenditures are carefully monitored and fully transparent. At the time of the meeting, there is an available balance of \$10,401. We know of at least \$3000 of expenses will be forthcoming for car title and tags, auto insurance and expenses for the trailer rehab. There will also be other expenses for furniture and other household items Jose, Yadira and Christen will need.

Movement of Funds from Capital Improvement Checking to CD At May 31, 2022, the balance in Capital Improvement checking is \$36,839. Finance Committee will recommend withdrawal of \$25,000 from Capital Improvement Checking and open a new Capi-

tal Improvement CD. We suggest a short-term CD of less than a year since rates for CD's appear to be getting higher and we don't want to get locked in on a long-term rate.

Hull Property Purchase not Capitalized on Balance Sheets
A review of our financial records revealed the purchase of the Hull
Property October 2017 was never capitalized and entered on our
financial balance sheet. The purchase price of the land and building
was \$27,500 and the demolition was \$14,000 for a total of
\$41,500. Bob will check with his accountant on the exact value that
should be capitalized, and we will then instruct Sue to make the appropriate accounting entry.

Mid-year Audit of Balance Sheet

All agreed a mid-year audit of the balance sheet should be performed following the June 2022 month end. Sue will provide all the necessary bank statements, CD statements, and any other documents required to complete this audit.

Parish Life-Thank you to all who help with this busy committee!! Refreshments have been provided for Pastor's Installation, end of year Sunday school, Katherine's prayer workshops, June food pantry and the Spring Fling. They will organize the church picnic in August. We held a Parish Life meeting today, June, 9th at 10:00 am. Our first discussion was about Father's Day. We decided to have donuts for Dads and coffee and juice. It will be set up in the Narthex and will be available after the service.

We went over our plan for intern Katherine's last official Sunday with us which is June 26th. We will have brunch after the service of egg casseroles, fruit, croissants, juice and coffee. Last meeting Sherry, Ruthie, Deb and Anita volunteered to make the casseroles. Kathy will bring grapes and strawberries and Dona will bring pineapple and cantaloupe. Jen will be putting a sign up sheet up so we know how many people to plan for. We will be setting up the tables and place setting on Saturday morning at 10:00.

Anita will discuss a possible visit to the Fruitbelt Farm workers with possibly a meal and/or health kits with Pastor Susan. She will find out who we should contact to set this up and decide on a date. Anita will ask Jen to put an article in the newsletter and bulletins and a sign up sheet to ask who would be interested to attend the August 20th, Lutheran fight hunger night at the York Revolutions. If we have enough interest we will go ahead and plan this event. Pastor Susan was contacted by Zwingli inviting Trinity to share in worship on August 28th and a covered dish brunch after the service

at the East Berlin park. This is the date that we chose for our picnic so this would be instead of our own picnic. As the pastor pointed out this would be a wonderful opportunity for sharing fellowship and collaboration with Zwingli. The Worship and Music committee will also be discussing this.

Thank you for all those that helped with the food pantry meal, the Pastor's installation meal and the spring fling. It is a lot of work to make these events successful, so thank you for all your help. Thank you to Chris Sheads for cleaning the sinks in the kitchen. They look so much better.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 4th. I am changing the time to 7:00 thinking this may be a better time to have more people able to attend the meeting.

Social Ministry-The Next Food Pantry will be held Wednesday, July 6 from 4:00-6:00pm.

Our Next Laundry Love date is Tuesday, June 14 from 5:30-6:30pm at the White Dove Laundromat. Please note that we are still collecting quarters!

WELCA picnic held Tuesday, June 7 at Janet McMaster's home. We voted to pay \$300 to the Food Pantry for Trinity's contribution for the second half of 2022. We will not meet again until Tuesday, September 6 at 5:30 at Janet McMaster's home again for a picnic. All ladies of Trinity are welcome and asked to bring a covered dish.

Mission in Motion-We are still waiting for a refugee family to arrive for the Hanover United Refugee Resettlement group to sponsor. Catholic Charities still does not know when a family will be placed in the area. We will begin helping as soon as we hear our help is needed. The José Project continues work on rehabbing the trailer for this sibling family. Hopefully, they will be moving into their new home in mid to late June. Thank you to the faithful workers! We also provide 2 meals each week for this family. Thank you to all those contributing to the meals! José has graduated and is now working full time. A used car has been purchased for him from the funds donated from multiple churches and community members. Dona reported that she wants our members to understand that the contributions for the José project are coming from many outside sources, and not all of those contributions are from Trinity. Many churches in our area, the Bermudian Springs School District and its teachers, plus others in our community are helping with this project with monetary contributions, as well as donations of their goods and services.

Outreach-Outreach will meet sometime in June after church to review the gift boxes sent to college students, and to discuss future gift boxes for the fall.
