What's Love got to do with it?

Do me a favor and read the book of **2 John** before you go any further....Don't worry, it's only 13 verses! Love. This is the first thing I want you to notice in John's words today. More than anything else, the Christian life is a life of love. When we abandon the fundamental doctrine of love, we do not "continue in the teaching of Christ," as John says in verse 9.

Love is the fundamental belief of the Christian faith. Jesus himself made this clear. When He was asked "What is the greatest commandment?," Jesus answered with a quote from the book of Deuteronomy. He said...

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-39)

Then Jesus summed it up in **John 13:35**, when He said... "By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." If you have been toying with any equation of spirituality that doesn't begin and end with the doctrine of love, you've missed the mark. Christianity is, first and last, about love. That's why John said...

(v. 5) And now, dear lady, I am not writing you a new command but one we have had from the beginning. I ask that we love one another.

Love is fundamental. It is supreme. It is the gospel in a word. That's the first thing we see in John's short letter, but we also see that LOVING UP CLOSE IS BETTER THAN LOVING FROM A DISTANCE.

John said...(v. 12) I have much to write to you, but I do not want to use paper and ink. Instead, I hope to visit you and talk with you face to face, so that our joy may be complete.

John is emphasizing the personal nature of the Christian life. It's so much more than pen and ink. It's much better face-to-face. The road to discipleship is not traveled by way of books and tapes and podcasts and TV preachers, even the good ones.

Of course, there is study involved in becoming a disciple and we should listen to as many sermons as we can and read as many books as we can and study as much as we can -- but the most powerful moments in the Christian life happen face-to-face.

I've had many incredible worship experiences in solitude, but the greatest worship experiences I've had have been in the presence of others.

Some of the most significant learning experiences I've had, the kind of learning experiences that are less about increasing knowledge and more about creating life

change, have happened in the presence of others, in the context of a Sunday School class or small groups. That's the power of community.

John was saying he wanted to do more than just send words on a page. He said, "I want to see **face-to-face**, so that our joy may be complete." We were made for community. We were made for personal contact with one another.

God isn't looking for a bunch of individuals who will love Him and serve Him merely as individuals. He wants those individuals to love Him and serve Him by loving one another and serving one another. Love is the be-all, end-all of the Christian life. It's our most fundamental belief, and our highest command.

As John said in a previous letter...

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. (1 John 4:7-8)

Did you hear that? "Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love." It's why John's letter is so urgent, because "his command is that you walk in love."

The Gospel, in a word, is love. There are people who will try to make it about politics, or financial prosperity, or the cultural wars, and they will distort the message of Jesus to suit their own agenda.

Instead, we need to proclaim the original, Biblical gospel message - Jesus Christ came into the world to save us from our sins and to give us a new life in Him. He called us to not only live in love, but to take this message of love and new life to a lost world.

Let us love one another. How do we put this into practice? It begins with this prayer: God, help me love others as You have loved me, so each person I meet today has a sense of Your great love for them.

What Must I Do?

In Matthew 19, a rich man comes to see Jesus and explains how he is following all of the rules but feels something is missing from his pursuit of God.

"All these rules I have kept," he says. "What do I still lack?' (v. 20)

In other words, "I am doing all of the basics of what's required...so why do I still feel I'm missing something?"

Jesus responds, "If you want to be perfect (whole), go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (v. 21)

The rich man goes away sad because he won't give up the one thing that consumes him. He is full of riches; he can't see how undernourished his soul is. Jesus doesn't mean this as a command for everyone who has money, it's meant for any who wallow in whatever abundance we might have.

He wants us to give up the one thing we crave more than Him. Then come, and follow Him!!

"If anyone wants to come after Me, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me." (Mark 8:34)

With Jesus, if we want to gain, we must give up. To be filled, we must deny ourselves.

To truly get close to God, we have to distance ourselves from other things. To conquer our cravings, we have to redirect them to God.

This July we are taking all of our summer events and rolling them into one month! We have Christmas in July collections for our adopted families this December, and our 3rd Summer Cash Bash to earn matching funds!

Last December Doorstep assisted 259 households involving 822 individuals with Christmas gifts, food, and gift cards. Each year we celebrate "Christmas in July" to get a jump on collecting new items for our annual Christmas adoption! Our goal is to help alleviate some of the strain during the holidays by also collecting items mid-year. Doorstep will adopt 260 households with 800+ individuals this December through the Christmas Bureau. We have created a more specific list of items this year, based on the requested items our families listed last Christmas. Our collection focus for Christmas in July is non-seasonal items that should be easily available this time of year.

Each school-aged child we adopt receives school supplies and a backpack, and each household receives a blanket and a health kit (filled with hygiene products) and wrapped with a new bath towel, hand towel and washcloth! Each child receives one bigger toy as their gift, and other smaller items are available along with games, books, stuffed animals, stocking stuffers, etc.

You can bring your Christmas donations to worship in July (if your congregation is open), or to Doorstep, Monday – Friday, 8am – 3pm.

Our 3rd Summer Cash Bash has our generous, anonymous donor offering up to \$15,000 in money if we receive donations of \$20,000 or more, during the month of July! Please note your congregation and 'Summer Cash Bash' on your donations so we apply it to the matching total! Donations typically drop during the summer months, and this will help Doorstep continue to operate, pay our bills, and help our neighbors in need pay theirs.


