#### **Comfort Bears of Chisago County**

In 2010 Trinity Lutheran sponsored an initiative called Kingdom Assignments, challenging the congregation to start programs that provide service to others. A number of congregation members rose to the challenge and "Comfort Bears" was born.

The mission of **Comfort Bears** is to provide comfort to children experiencing crisis or significant emotional events. Distributed through the Chisago County Sherriff's office at the Chisago County Government Center, approximately 4,500 stuffed animals have been put into the hands of children since 2010. Teddy bears, dogs, frogs, lions and other animals make up this menagerie.

The bears come from various sources, and the generosity of Trinity's members has helped fund the purchase of these bears through Endowment Fund donations, Thrivent Community Impact cards and donations of new stuffed animals from members directly. 
#### Saint Paul Area Synodical Women's Organization Convention

As you can see from the chart above, at the end of May, Trinity is over budget by \$26,467.97. So far, we have not had to transfer money to cover expenses, with the exception of the money to cover the audit. The money to pay for the audit came out of Operation Reserves and was approved by the council in April 2021.

In July, statements will be sent out to all members, so this is a good time to remind everyone to catch up on your pledges if you are behind.

\*"Trying a Plant-Based Diet"

When Earth was created, God entrusted us as its stewards and has called us to care for it and each other in all of our actions. Being good stewards of resources means using those resources wisely, especially in terms of our food supply.

#### **DID YOU KNOW:**

Our growing population is pushing food security to the edge. In its current form, we will not be able to feed the over 9 billion people expected to inhabit the Earth by 2050, and what we're eating is pushing the planet to the breaking point on climate change and deforestation. The food system is responsible for over a quarter of all greenhouse gas emissions, of which approximately 80% are associated with livestock production.

Adopting a completely plant-based diet may not be for everyone, but plant-based diets have been shown to provide significant health benefits like reducing heart disease, obesity, diabetes, and some cancers.

#### **TODAY, I CAN:**

Reduce my meat consumption by having one meat-free day or meal per week.

Buy meat from local farmers whose livestock are grass fed or free-range fed.

Learn more about sustainable agricultural practices and support farmers who use them.

Plant a vegetable garden and start my own compost pile to help nourish it.

Create meat-free recipes for my family to enjoy.
