Dear Friends,

As we approach Independence Day it is always worth reflecting on the document that was signed on July 4, 1776 – the Declaration of Independence. As Christians, it is also instructive for us to recognize that the Declaration mentions or refers to God four different times. Though not an overtly Christian document, the Declaration certainly didn't shy away from the Founders' overarching belief in God. Let's look at these four very different reference to God in the Declaration:

*When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of **Nature's God** entitle them...*

Through God's role as the creator and ruler of nature, we have a basic moral law known as the "natural law." This is the law to which the Founders appealed when declaring their independence from the British king.

*We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are **endowed by their Creator** with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.*

Here the Founders explicitly note that human beings are created by God and given a level of dignity and a measure of rights through their relationship with the Creator.

*We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress Assembled, appealing to **the Supreme Judge of the world** for the rectitude of our intentions...*

This phrase recognizes God's role as a judge of all people. In fact, he is "the Supreme Judge," a judge over persons and nations.

*And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on **the protection of divine Providence**, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor.*

With each mention of God in the Declaration, He becomes more personal and involved. First, he is evident in nature. Second, he is our creator. Third, he is our judge. And now, finally, he protects us through his providence – his power and authority in the word.

And God has protected us well for 246 years. The time has come to once again take seriously the words of our Declaration of Independence, and to seek out the protective providence of our one and only God once again.

NMUMC CELEBRATING 150 YEARS – A LOOK INTO OUR PAST

In the Spring of 1872 the New Market Methodist Episcopal Church was organized from some of the local citizens and the remaining members of the Old Finley Chapel Church, located three and one-half miles Northeast of here.

Services or classes as they were then called, were first held in a small building on West Main Street at the Southeast corner of West Main Street and Sixth Street. Rev. Jesse Green of the Ladoga Charge was the minister and Rev. Samuel Godfrey was the Presiding Elder.

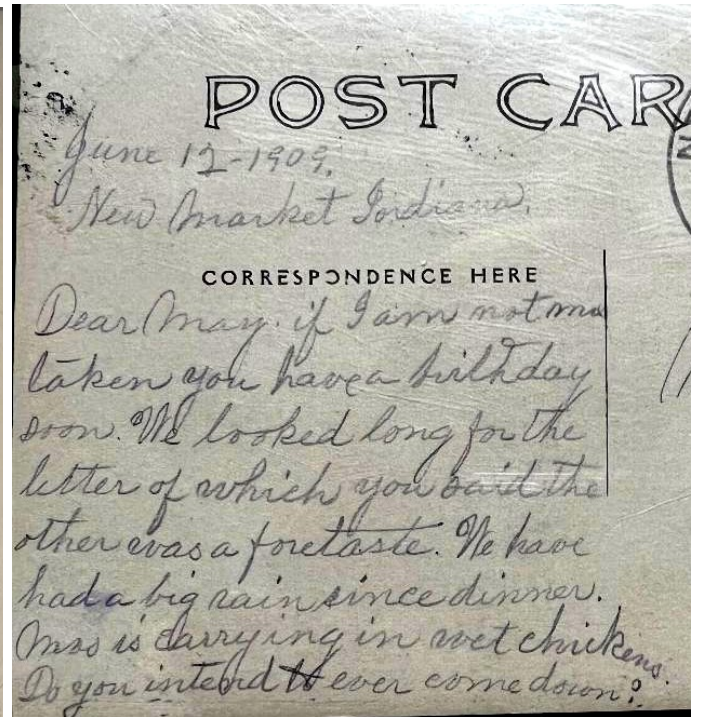
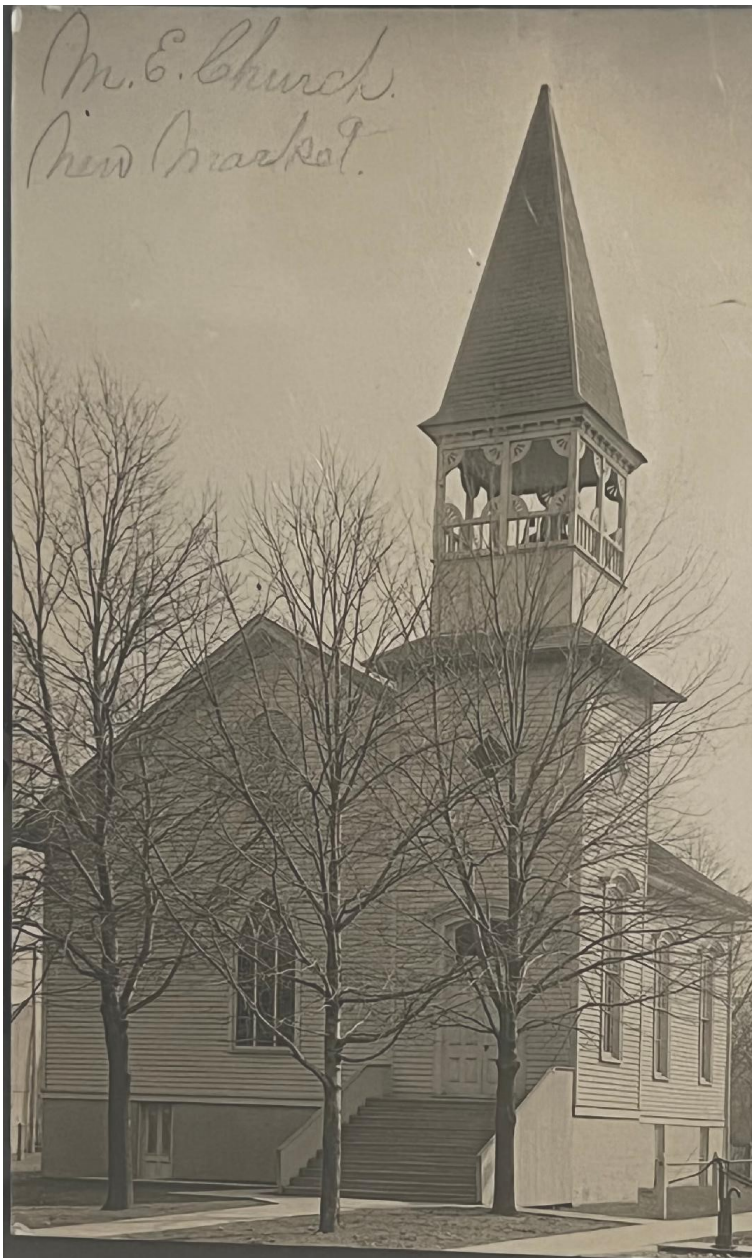
There was no church house of any denomination in the little village in 1872. These early Methodists felt the need of one. A plot of land for the erection of a new church at the intersection of Main and Third Streets in the North-West corner of Scott Township, was donated. The donor was Joseph White, a circuit rider who came from Ohio, with his wife, Lucinda, with the provision that the ground be used for no other purpose.

According to the County records, “at the fourth session of the Quarterly Conference of the Ladoga Circuit, Northwest Indiana Conference, Greencastle District, held at Ladoga, August 31, 1872, the following names were elected trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church at New Market: Joseph White, Levi Byrd, W.T. Hicks, William K. White, A.J. Shular, Joseph Wilson, and John W. White.”

These trustees acted as the building committee for the erection of a new House of Worship. The building contract was let to S.F. Buchanan, and ground was broken in September 1872. By August 1873 the edifice was completed and dedicated the last Sunday of September 1873. Dr. Andrus, President of Indiana Asbury University (now DePauw University) preached the dedicatory sermon and the dedication service was conducted by John L. Smith, Presiding Elder of the Waveland Circuit.

A partial list of the charter members include Mr. And Mrs. Joseph White, Mr. And Mrs. John White, Mr. and Mrs. William White, Mr. And Mrs. Joseph Kelsey, Mr. And Mrs. Shepherd Buchanan, Sevilla White, Joel Buchanan, William Wray, Marv Buchanan and Joseph Wilson. Others who joined soon afterward were Dr. B.F. Hutchings, Mr. And Mrs. Marion Watkins and the Andrew Shular family. Three of the charter members were men who had helped to plat the town. The first organist was Anna Kelsey and later Callie Fulwider. John Fulwider directed the singing. The first stewards were John White and Joel Buchanan.

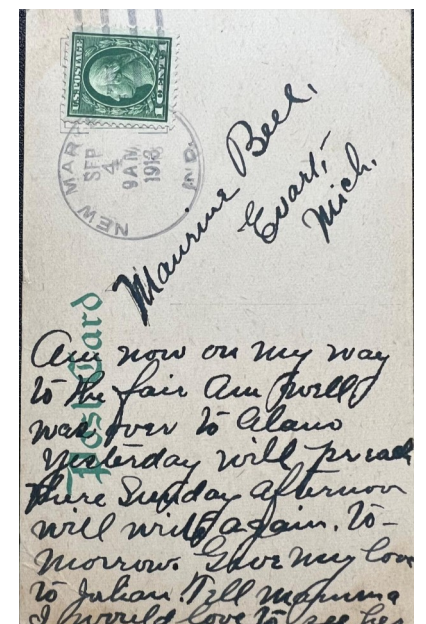
The first wedding solemnized in the church was that of Miss Mary Buchanan and Mr. F.S. Wray, February 24, 1874, with the pastor Rev. J.C. Stevens, performing the ceremony. Two other early marriages that took place in the Church were those of Miss Mellie Seaman and Mr. George Davis on New Year's Day, 1885, and Miss Ethel Armstrong and Mr. Albert J. Armantrout in 1902. The funeral of Mrs. Mary Buchanan Wray was the first to be held in the church.

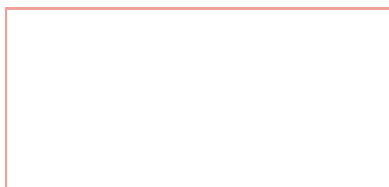

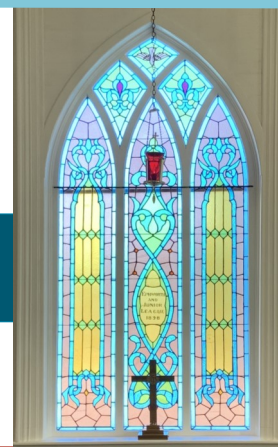
