Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – July 10th 2022

For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach.

“Throwing young people down a wall” is how we rather roughly described our activity last weekend. I was part of a team running a 7m abseil tower during Surrey Scoutabout – a camp for scouts and guides with some 6,500 on site. We were not, of course, throwing people off: there were systems in place to make sure that everything was safe as the young people abseiled down. Some of them were a bit nervous. Some said they were, others had a bit of ‘elvis leg’. Not all were sure they could manage it, but with some encouraging words and a tight safety rope nearly everyone did lower themselves over the edge and down the 7m to the ground.

Our repeated struggles and failures to live a perfect and holy life can lead us to conclude that it is not possible for us and so we should accept how we are. And because God is full of love and compassion he will sort everything out in the end. The Good News is indeed that God will sort out everything in the end – he will finish the work he started in us that we have not been able to complete. But he also wants us to grow in wholeness and holiness as we journey through life, because it is through wholeness and holiness that we become more fully alive and so give greater glory to him.

At the present time there is so much that is outside of our control – in politics, in many of the places we work and in the wider economy. The Word of God this weekend draws our attention to those things that are within our control, and in particular to how we respond in the love of God and the love of our neighbour. The call to love of neighbour for Christians is an invitation to be attentive to the needs of the stranger as well as those closest to us. It mirrors the concern for the stranger that is found throughout the Old Testament and seen in its fullest in the way in which God reaches down and out to us in Jesus Christ.

On a practical point, the two foodbanks in Godalming are always in need of support and are expecting high demand during the school holidays. There are drop off points in many of the supermarkets and anything left at the back of St Edmund’s or St Joseph’s will be taken up to the food bank at St Mark’s. The SVP in our parish do great work in reaching out to the housebound and others who call on their support: maybe have a think about joining them if you need help in doing a little bit more.
