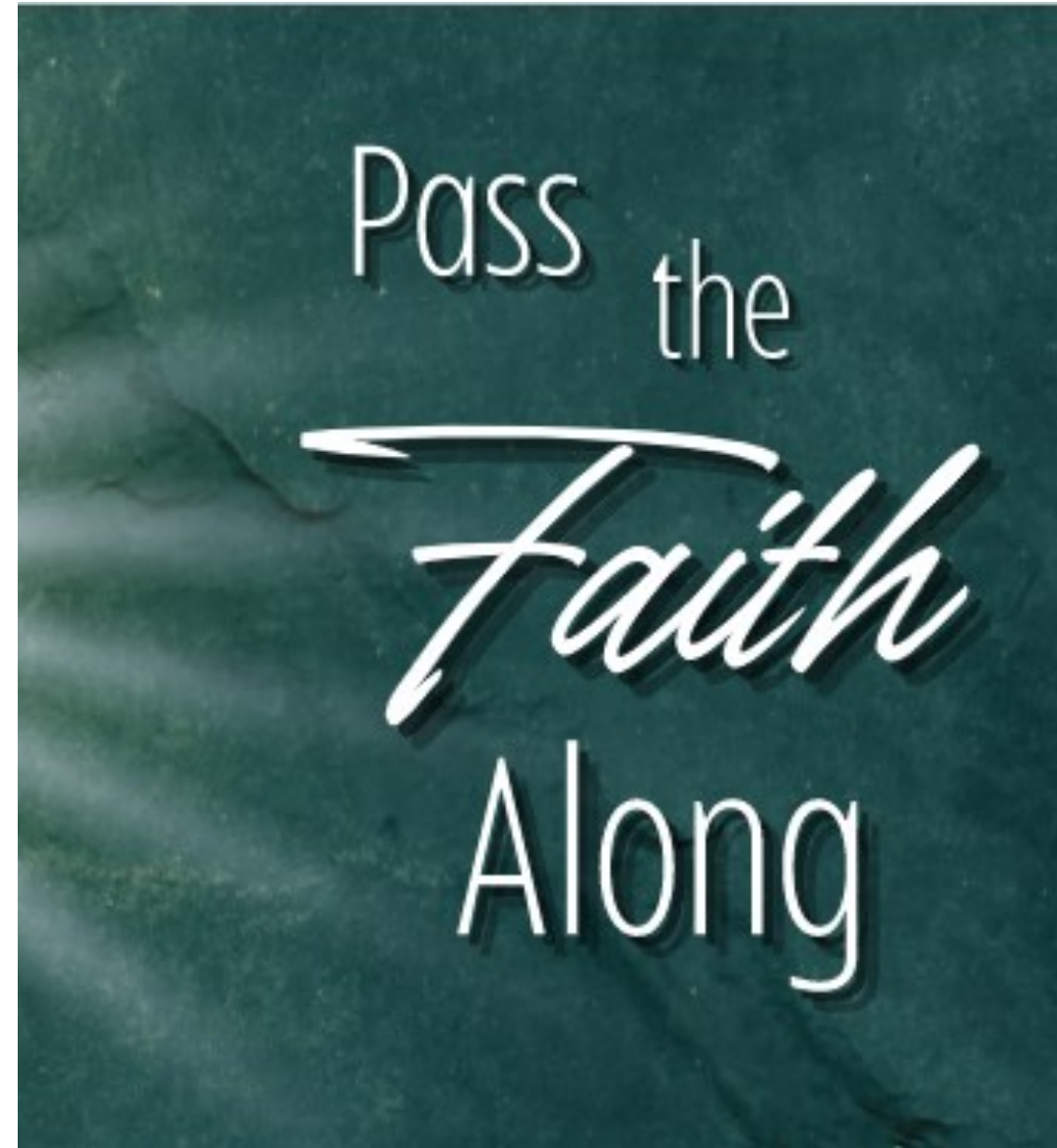

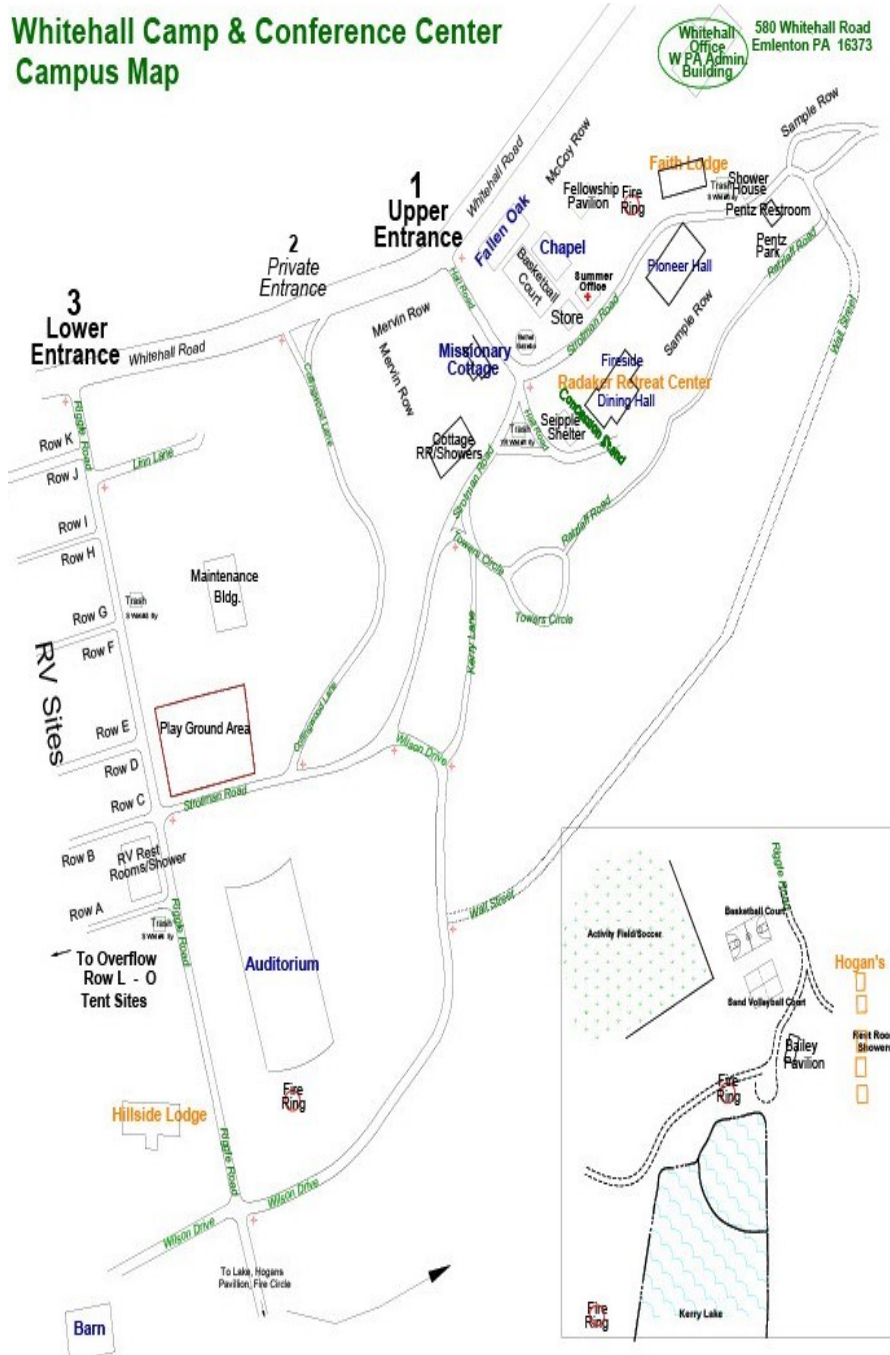

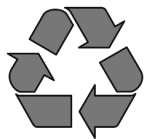

PET POLICIES

Whitehall Camp does not encourage pets.
However, pets are permitted **IF YOU ABIDE** by these guidelines:

1. Pets on a leash are to be taken only to the **"Pet Walking Areas"** and **MUST be "picked up" after**. Areas are located on the lower grounds in the field behind the RV section and on the upper grounds in the field behind Faith Lodge.
2. Pets are to be leashed at all times when outside the cabin or camper.
3. Pets are to be confined to the leased lot of the owner.
4. Pet owners are responsible for picking up deposited residue at all times during the camping season and are to be prepared with small plastic bags for such purpose. This includes personal leased lots and pet areas.
5. Pets are to be restricted during Camp Meeting to only the areas listed above; the walking area and the leased lot of the owner.
6. Pet owners will be asked to remove the animal from the grounds if they become a nuisance to those around them.
7. No pet, with the **exception of service animals** (this does not include emotional support animals) is permitted in any buildings managed by Whitehall Camp.



CAMP MEETING POLICIES

During Camp Meeting, we ask that you help us by cooperating with the following:

1. All fees should be paid at the Whitehall Summer Camp Office including utilities and other charges for cottage, mobile home, tent or recreational vehicles.
2. Mail may be received and deposited for mailing at the Whitehall Summer Camp Office.
3. If articles of value are lost or found, please report these to the Whitehall Summer Camp Office.
4. No mini-bikes, bicycles, tricycles, skateboards, in-line skates, four-wheelers, or scooters are to be used on the grounds. The speed limit is 10 mph for all other transportation. **ALL MOTOR VEHICLES, INCLUDING GOLF CARTS, MUST BE DRIVEN BY PERSONS WITH A CURRENT, VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE.** All non-street legal motorized vehicles (i.e. golf carts, side-by sides, and hoverboards) must be registered at the Summer Camp Office before being operated on the campground.
5. Parents are responsible for the actions and behaviors of their children, and of the children's friends in their care. **Please know the whereabouts of your children and what they are doing.**
6. Fireworks of any kind are forbidden.
7. Persons damaging or destroying camp or personal property will be held responsible.
8. Garbage is to be placed inside the dumpster. No garbage is to be stacked in front of the dumpsters. This is for **normal household garbage only.** No metal, toilets, refrigerators, furniture or wood is to be placed in the dumpsters. Disposal of such is the responsibility of lease-holder.
9. The land surrounding Whitehall Camp is private property. The area behind the hogans, below the lake, and along Panther Spring is privately owned land. Please respect private property.
10. All RVs must be parked in approved RV areas. No RVs or tents are to be located adjacent to cottages, homes or mobile homes.

- 14. No profane language, or improper behavior will be permitted on the grounds.
- 15. In the interest of unity and reconciliation, no political or other controversial items should be displayed.
- 16. Anyone found to be a disturbance, creating an unsafe environment or acting with malicious intent toward guests during Camp Meeting, will be asked to leave the premises with no expectation of a refund.
- 17. All persons using the camp facilities during Camp Meeting are encouraged to attend the services, conferences, and other activities of the Camp Meeting.
- 18. Firewood is available for \$5.00 per wheel barrow load near the entrance to the maintenance building on Riggle Road. Please pay for the wood at the Summer Camp Office.
- 19. **No evening campfires are permitted until after the conclusion of the evening service. Campfires are to be in fire rings and not left unattended. Fires should be extinguished at end of night.** Whitehall reserves the right to ban fires during dry periods.
- 20. Please respect quiet time starting at 11:30 pm. Individuals should be in their residences by midnight. All non-residents must leave the grounds by midnight.
- 21. All media (TV's, radios, CD, iPods, etc.) are not to be played outside of dwellings or in cars in a loud and disruptive manner.
- 22. Single persons under age 18 are not permitted to stay overnight on the grounds without an adult in the same residence.

Whitehall Camp and WPA Ministries Camp Meeting Committee reserve the right to enforce these policies.

SECURITY



SECURITY OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the Camp Meeting Security Team is to provide a safe and secure environment during the week of Camp Meeting. Security will be watching for any suspicious behavior or dangerous activities and taking action when needed. Security may be called to assist in deescalating any altercations that may arise during the week.

The Security team will carry a First—Aid and Trauma Kit on one security cart at all times to provide a quick response to any accidents that may occur. In an emergency situation the Security Team will act as first responders assisting at the scene and directing emergency personnel to the site. In the event of a severe weather warning and imminent danger the Security Team will alert campers and direct them to the nearest shelter.

Infractions of Camp Policy will be handled by Whitehall Camp & Conference Staff unless deemed to be of a dangerous nature by security personal. It is the Security Team’s responsibility to notify the State Police of any illegal or life threatening actions.

“The New Testament Call to Disciple Others”

“Jesus said: ‘Go make disciples of all nations...’ (Matthew 20:19)”

What is discipleship, and why is it important to the very cause of Christianity? Well, the reason is because of the object of discipleship: Jesus.

A *disciple* is a *student*. A disciple with regard to the Bible (specifically the New Testament) typically refers to students/followers of Jesus Christ. The original 12-disciples of Jesus would carry out the mission and the ministry started by Jesus.

That same mission and mandate exists for the church today; it didn’t die or fade with the 1st century church. Discipleship is as much a mandate for followers/students of Christ today as it was 2000 years ago. The question is, how is the church doing? Are we making disciples? Do we even know what that means? Who’s responsible to make disciples and why is it important anyway? Are there obstacles to discipleship, and if so, what are they? And finally, how does one “make” disciples? All these questions and more will be explored in this five-day study.

The five questions we will explore are as follows:

Discipleship: What is it? – In this session we will explore what *being* a disciple, and what *making* disciples means.

Discipleship: Why is it important? – In this session, we will learn that without discipleship, the message of hope through salvation in Christ would stop going forth into all the world.

Discipleship: Who’s Responsible? – In this session we will explore how Jesus’ death, resurrection, and commission empowered all believers to make disciples.

Discipleship: Where are the Obstacles? – In this session we will learn about the many tactics of the enemy to thwart the Good News from going forth.

Discipleship: How do I do it? – In this session we will explore the various different ways of making disciples.

Pastor Earley obtained his bachelor’s degree in Management and Quantitative Methods from Illinois State University in 2000. With the guidance of his pastor at the time, Dr. E. Raymond Chin, he enrolled in Anderson University’s School of Theology, where he received his Master of Divinity degree in 2003.

Rev. Earley graduated from the School of Theology a second time with a Doctor of Ministry degree in May of 2008. In October of 2013, a component of his dissertation, *A Strategy to Transform the Lay Members of the Metropolitan Church of God into Ministers*, was published by Warner Press as *Every-Member Ministry: Spiritual Gifts and God’s Design For Service*.

He has formerly served on the board of directors for the Detroit Branch NAACP, Urban League of Southeast Michigan, the Church of God in Michigan, and Anderson University. He has ministered within the National Association of the Church of God as the creator and director of the Leadership Academy and served as president of the National Inspirational Youth Convention from 2016-2019. As a chaplain for the Detroit Police Department Chaplain Corp, he rose to the rank of Commander Chaplain.

Dr. Earley currently serves as the chaplain for Concerned Black Clergy of Metropolitan Atlanta, the Vice President for the Cascade Area Neighborhood Association, the parliamentarian for the NACOG, and is a member of the Berean Fellowship, led by Bishop Timothy J. Clarke.

An ardent fan of the Chicago Bears, Dr. Earley and his lovely wife Precious Ann have been graced with three lovely children Kevin Wesley, Jr.; Kaleb Van; and Ky Elise.

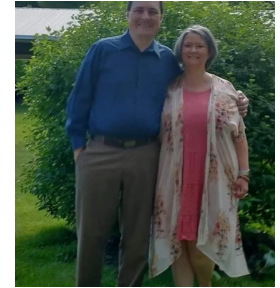
