## **Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – July 17th 2022**

*Martha and Mary of Bethany and Mary of Magdala.*

I have been teaching the liturgy module of CCRS and last weekend a question came up about the ordination of women as deacons. The matter is still open and it may be some time before an answer becomes clear. The presence of Martha and Mary, probably two of the best friends of Jesus, in the Gospel this Sunday and the Feast of Mary Magdalene on Friday make this weekend an opportune moment to touch on a couple of developments that may bring visible changes in the coming years.

The first is the raising of the celebration of Mary Magdalene to a Feast and the clarification of her role as faithful disciple and 'apostle of the apostles' and not the repentant prostitute with whom she has too often been confused.

The second is a change in the legal constitution of the roman curia – the church's central support structure. In its new constitution – *Predicate Evangelium* (preach the Gospel) – Pope Francis explains that the authority of those within it comes from their relationship with him (rather than from their own ordination bishop). Any of the faithful may therefore be appointed to leadership roles in the Vatican. Pope Francis has made a number of significant appointments over recent years and more can be expected. Last week, for example, three women were appointed to the Dicastery for Bishops (the body that makes recommendations to the Pope on their appointment).

The third is the opening of the formal and stable roles of reader, acolyte and catechist to both women and men as lay ministries in the church. We are familiar with many different people reading in the liturgy and leading catechesis, but even if not particularly visible for most of the last 1000 years the church has a tradition of people being formally appointed to these as formal positions within the Christian community after a period of formation and with attendant duties.

These are small steps, but we may pray and hope that they are part of a journey in which the gifts of women and men are able more readily to serve the building up of the body of Christ and the proclamation of the Gospel.

Here in our parish I am conscious that it can sometimes look very male-heavy at the front of the church. I am grateful to Sean and the young people who serve on the altar, but I would be very happy for other adults to help with the rites as altar servers if they felt called to do so.
