## **Answers to Sermon Notes**

The Ten Words: The Fifth Word Deuteronomy 5:16 7/17/22

- 1. Today we begin the second table of content of the Ten Commandments with those commandments that comprehensively **govern** our relationships with **others** in this world.
  - **a.** More specifically, however, they govern our relationship to <u>human life</u>.
  - **b.** You could say, upon further reflection, that the first table governs our relationship to the <u>God</u> of <u>Life</u> and the second table governs our relationship to the <u>gift</u> of <u>life</u>.
    - i. As individuals, each of us is a recipient of the **individual** aspects of that gift, and together, we are fellow recipients of the corporate or **communal** aspects of that gift.
    - ii. The gift of human life is not simply something we hold **<u>individually</u>**, it is also something we hold **<u>together</u>**.
    - iii. These commandments, then, foster **<u>human</u>** flourishing in this world.
    - iv. To be truly <u>concerned</u> about these commandments, then, we need not only to see them as part of what it means to live righteously as <u>believers</u>, but also what it means to contribute to the overall <u>flourishing</u> of all human life.
      - a. It is not simply part of what it means for us to live out God's <u>saving</u> grace in our lives, it is part of our embracing God's <u>common</u> grace to all. (Love your <u>neighbor</u>...) (Mt. 5:43-48)
      - b. <u>Why</u> do we seek to follow these commandments?
        - 1. Not just because God said so, or it pleases him..
        - 2. But, because it **facilitates** the flourishing of human life.
  - c. As those to whom God's wisdom and truth have been <u>revealed</u>, we proclaim the first table of the law as our work of <u>evangelism</u> and we proclaim the second table of the law as our work of <u>cultural</u> engagement (contributing to the flourishing of human life). (Acts 14:15-17, Deut. 4:5-8))
- 2. These 6 commandments cover our relationship to <u>human life</u> under these headings:
  - a. The <u>Structures</u> of Human Life. "Honor your father and mother."
  - **b.** The <u>Value</u> of Human Life.
- "You shall not murder."
- **c.** The **Furtherance** of Human Life. "You shall not commit adultery."
  - fe. "You shall not steal."
- d. The <u>Sustaining</u> of Human Life.e. The <u>Language</u> of Human Life.
  - "You shall not bear false witness."
- f. The <u>Enjoyment</u> of Human Life. "You shall not covet."
- 3. As we begin to unpack the first of these commandments, dealing with the **<u>structures</u>** of human life, we need to begin by reminding ourselves that God is a God of **<u>order</u>**.
  - a. In the <u>design</u> of creation. (Genesis 1:14-18)
  - **b.** In the <u>cycles</u> of creation. (Genesis 8:20-22)
  - c. In the <u>worship</u> of the church. (I Cor. 14:33)
  - d. In the dispersement of mankind. (Acts 17:24-27)
  - e. In the unfolding and securing of our <u>salvation</u>. (Ephesians 1:3-14)
    - i. It is only because God is a God of <u>order</u> that we have <u>life</u>, either physical or spiritual.
      - a.  $\underline{\mathbf{Order}} = \underline{\mathbf{Life}}$  (James 3:13-16)
- 4. As a part of God's ordered **<u>design</u>** for human life he has ordained several <u>**structured**</u> relationships.
  - a. Structured in that they involve <u>authority</u>/responsibility of one over <u>another</u>.
  - **b.** And require us to <u>submit</u> ourselves appropriately.

- **c.** None of these authorities have <u>**absolute**</u> power/authority, but they are entrusted by God with <u>**real**</u> power/authority.
  - i. To facilitate **<u>human flourishing</u>**.
- 5. The most important of these structured relationships, and the <u>chief</u> example that God gives in the commandment, is the structured relationship between <u>parents</u> and <u>children</u>.
  - **a.** Parents <u>are given</u> authority over, and responsibility for, their children.
    - i. This is the case because human beings need to be **<u>raised</u>**.
      - a. Loved, nurtured, <u>taught</u>, disciplined, trained, <u>entrusted</u> with responsibility.
      - b. Prepared for <u>mature</u>, adult human <u>living</u> and flourishing. (Proverbs 29:15-17)
        - 1. "...that it may **<u>go</u> well** with you..."
      - c. <u>**Refusal**</u> to discipline brings death. (Proverbs 19:18)
      - d. Refusal to **<u>submit</u>** to this brings death. (Proverbs 30:11-17)
    - ii. Since this authority has a **<u>purpose</u>**, it has **<u>boundaries</u>**. (Ephesians 6:1-4)
      - a. <u>Abuse</u> leads to the <u>opposite</u> of human flourishing. (Colossians 3:21)
    - iii. To **honor** them means to obey them, but it also means to recognize just how **important** they are in the life you will live.
      - a. Every child should **<u>pray</u>** that their parents are **<u>faithful</u>** to this calling.
      - b. But, parents must be faithful even when their children do not **<u>understand</u>**.
      - c. You must  $\underline{love}$  them more than you want/need them to  $\underline{love}$  you.
      - d. <u>Appreciation</u> often requires time and maturity.
  - **b.** The current state of this structured relationship is <u>disarray</u>, and the results are felt by <u>all</u>.
    - The authority of parents is being <u>denied</u> by the state and its schools.
      - a. The need for parental **<u>notification</u>** or approval is denied.
      - b. Parental <u>control</u> of curriculum is denied.
      - c. This is a course of <u>death</u> for our children and all children.
        - 1. It must be **<u>opposed</u>**.
    - ii. Parents are <u>failing</u>.

i.

- a. Fathers are often <u>absent</u>.
- b. There is often a **<u>failure</u>** to discipline.
- c. There is very little **<u>respect</u>** for any authority figures.
- d. Parents are not doing enough to <u>secure</u> this God-ordained role.
- 6. We often ask, "Why?" Why is there such destruction and violence and abuse in our society?
  - a. Let's <u>start</u> here. This is where <u>God</u> starts.
  - **b.** "If you want human flourishing, you must <u>secure</u> the <u>structured</u> relationship between parents and their children."
- 7. But, while this is the <u>chief</u> example of the structured relationships God has given for our good, there are <u>others</u>.
  - a. <u>Husband</u> and <u>Wife</u>. (Colossians 3:18-19)
  - **b.** <u>**Master**</u> and <u>**Servant.**</u> (Colossians 3:22 4:1)
  - c. <u>Civil Magistrate</u> and <u>Citizen.</u> (Romans 13:1-7)
  - d. <u>Church</u> and <u>Believer</u>. (Hebrews 13:17)
- 8. Every one of these relationships is <u>ordained</u> by God to increase our flourishing and the flourishing of human **community**.
  - **a.** And each of them is in a state of **<u>disrepair</u>**.
  - b. And it isn't enough for us to say, "Well, of course they are; this is a <u>fallen</u> world." For, these were designed <u>for</u> this fallen world to keep it from descending <u>unhindered</u> into darkness and suffering.
    - i. And to point all to the God of <u>life</u> and <u>salvation</u>.
  - **c.** As those to whom these things have been <u>revealed</u>, we must be active in their <u>defense</u>, strengthening and proper <u>use</u>.
