VBS THIS UPCOMING WEEK


VBS will be July 24th-27th from 6pm-8pm at Graham Street Church of Christ. Dinner will be served on Sunday and Wednesday nights.

B's Dabbling's

Small Groups for Encouragement and Support

This fall we want to be more intentional about our small groups. Our summer efforts in addressing the "3 Big Questions" was designed to help us with that. To have great small groups that provide encouragement and support to the group members, all members of the group need to be intentional about accomplishing that goal. The story of Job illustrates this. It begins with Satan telling God that the faith of the prosperous man named Job was not as strong as God thinks, for if Job were to face great crisis, he would cast aside his faith in God. God tells Satan that He believes Job's faith is deeper than that and God allows Satan to tempt Job. Satan causes Job to lose everything and is stricken with horrible sickness. The book chronicles Job's faith journey while wrestling with the great "Why God?" question. On this journey some of Job's friends try to help, and in the process, Job gives them, and us, a lesson, in helping people in crisis through small groups.

Job 16:1-5 (NRSV)

Then Job answered: "I have heard many such things; miserable comforters are you all. Have windy words no limit? Or what provokes you that you keep on talking? I also could talk as you do, if you were in my place; I could join words together against you, and shake my head at you. I could encourage you with my mouth, and the solace of my lips would assuage your pain.

Job basically says to them, "You are lousy comforters. You are not helping, you are making things worse, why do you keep talking? If I were in your place, I would try to do it differently; instead of speaking to you with accusation, I would try to use my mouth to bring comfort and ease your pain." Job tells them that they are incompetent and arrogant, lacking compassion and empathy. They don't know what they are doing, and they don't have the humility to listen and learn. In our care for the people we serve, we must have both competence and humility. We certainly need the training, knowledge, and skill to do our job well. And we need to give the assurance that we have the gifts and resources to take care of their needs. At the same time, it is important that they know they are being heard and that we are truly aware of their needs, that they are being validated in putting their care in our hands and that we will do it with compassion. Competence with compassion and humility can be a difficult balance at times, but it begins with the words Job used to advise his friends, "If you were in my place," in other words, you should have started by trying to put yourself in my place and treat me like you would have wanted to be treated. It is what Jesus said in Mat. 7:12, and we call it the Golden Rule. The first rule for a great small group is the Golden Rule!


