

Preparing for the Final Exam

2 Corinthians 13:5-10 July 24, 2022

The Big Idea: Tests are a part of life. We take them to prove mastery of a subject, that we know the rules of the road, that we are worthy of the uniform, and so on. One day, we will stand before the Lord for our final exam. [Romans 14:12] The Bible says the way to prepare for that day is to engage in regular self-examination.

2 Corinthians 13:5-10 (ESV)

13 **Examine** yourselves, to see whether you are *in the faith*.

<u>Test</u> <u>yourselves</u>. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, <u>that</u>
<u>Jesus Christ is in you</u>?—<u>unless indeed you fail to meet the test!</u> ⁶ I hope you will find out that we have not failed the test.

⁷ But <u>we pray to God that you may not do wrong</u>—not that we may appear to have met the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed. ⁸ For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth. ⁹ For **we are glad** when we are weak and you are strong. Your **restoration** <u>is what</u> <u>we pray for</u>. ¹⁰ For this reason I write these things while I am away from you, that when I come I may not have to be severe in my use of the authority that the Lord has given me for building up and not for tearing down.

HOW DO WE EXAMINE OURSELVES?

- 1. Ask if you believe the Essentials of the Faith.
 - That we are all sinners, without hope, except through Christ.
 - That our Triune God has done all that is necessary for our salvation – forgiveness and reconciliation to the Lord.

- o God became flesh when the Son came to us.
- Jesus lived a perfect life of obedience and righteousness and He alone was qualified to be the sacrifice for our sin.
- Through the Crucifixion, all our sin was taken on by Jesus and the penalty for that sin was paid by Him.
- o In the Resurrection of Jesus, God's power over Sin, Satan, and Death was powerfully and completely shown.
- 2. Answer this Question: Is Jesus Christ in you? (Mark 1:15)
 - Have you repented of your sin?
 - Have you trusted Christ alone for your salvation?
- 3. Encouragement for Your Assurance [1 John 5:11-13]
 - The witness of the Holy Spirit in your heart. (Romans 8:9, 16)
 - The love for your spiritual brothers and sisters.
 (1 John 3:14)
 - Hearing and heeding Jesus' voice. (John 10:27)
 - Practicing righteousness? (1 John 2:29; 3:9)
 - In Christ, you have overcome the world so that you are living a life of godly separation from the world. (1 John 5:4)
 - The restoration of your life (2 Corinthians 13:9)
 - Trust in the promise of Jesus. (John 10:28-30)
