## **Answers to Sermon Notes**

The Ten Words: The Sixth Word

Deuteronomy 5:17

7/24/22

- 1. This morning, we continue our study of the second table of content of the Ten Commandments with the sixth commandment: You shall not **murder**.
  - **a.** As we do so, let's remember that as the first table governs our relationship to the **God** of **Life**, the second table governs our relationship to the **gift** of **life**.
    - i. This gift we receive both as **individuals** and as a **community**.
    - ii. We have a responsibility to **apply** it **both** as individuals and as communities.
      - a. This is the **civil** use of the law.
    - iii. This is not simply about **private** morality, it is also about **public** morality.
  - **b.** Looked at another way, the first table of the law has a unique relationship to the special (**saving**) grace of God that leads to restored relationship with him in **Christ**, the second table of the law has a unique relationship to the **common** grace of God that leads us to the fullest experience of human **flourishing** that can be achieved in this world.
    - i. As our perfect <u>Father</u>, God continues to <u>pour</u> out his common graces on all. (Mt. 5:48)
    - ii. And use it to **point** to his goodness, glory, and **salvation**.
    - iii. His people, then, have a special <u>responsibility</u> not only to live by these, but also to <u>share</u> them with all, that all might be <u>blessed</u>.
- 2. These 6 commandments cover our relationship to **human life** under these headings:
  - **a.** The **Structures** of Human Life. "Honor your father and mother."
  - **b.** The <u>Value</u> of Human Life. "You shall not murder."
  - **c.** The **Furtherance** of Human Life. "You shall not commit adultery."
  - **d.** The **Sustaining** of Human Life. "You shall not steal."
  - e. The Language of Human Life. "You shall not bear false witness."
  - f. The **Enjoyment** of Human Life. "You shall not covet."
- 3. While understanding and embracing the **structures** of human life is essential, we will not **advance** far in our contribution to human **flourishing** unless we appreciate the incredible **value** of human life.
- 4. We want to look at this value in **three senses**.
  - **a.** Human life has **practical** or **purposeful** value. (Genesis 1:26-28)
    - i. Mankind was created in order to have **dominion** over the earth.
      - a. To take in **hand** what God had made.
      - b. To tend and **develop** it.
      - c. According to their unique **giftedness**. (Cain, Abel, Jabal, Jubal, Tubal-cain)
      - d. **Jesus**, himself, was a **tekton**.
      - e. Capable of great accomplishments. (Gen. 11:5-6)
    - ii. This command is known as the **Cultural** Mandate.
      - a. The development and **flourishing** of mankind was the **intention**.
      - b. Man is not the **problem** with the world, he is the **purpose** for the world.
        - 1. **Anthropic** Principle
        - 2. We were not intended to be the **guardians** of the garden, but rather the **masters** of the matter.
      - c. While currently stained with sin, human <u>culture</u> is a testimony to the <u>value</u> of mankind.

- d. In fact, man's **problem**-solving abilities shine as he works against the **curse**.
- **b.** Human Life has **experiential** value.
  - i. There is great **satisfaction** in using your gifts for this purpose. (Proverbs 12:11, II Timothy 2:6)
- **c.** Human life has **intrinsic** value. (Genesis 1:26-28)
  - i. Human life is inherently valuable because it is **made** in the **image** of God.
    - a. This is a fundamental reality of our **being**, so it belongs to all human beings from **conception** (Psalm 139:13), giving **equal** value to all.
      - 1. Old, young, rich, **poor**, male, female, hipsters, **rednecks**, democrats, republicans, black, white, yellow, red, **brown**, olive, healthy, sick, strong, **weak**, etc.
      - 2. Aside from any value of what you can <u>do</u>, your fundamental value rests in what you **are**: you are a human being, made in the **image** of **God**.
    - b. Additionally, his image in us is also manifested in our **sharing** God's communicable **attributes**:
      - 1. Intellectual: Knowledge, Wisdom, Truth, Reason, Communication, etc.
      - 2. Moral: **Right**, Wrong, **Conscience**, and capable of Love, Mercy, **Honor**, etc.
      - 3. Volitional: **Purpose**, Will, **Power**, etc.
    - c. This was necessary in order for him to be given **dominion**.
  - ii. The **intrinsic** value of human life leads:
    - a. to this **commandment**, and
    - b. to **everything** that falls within it. (Matthew 5:21-22)
  - iii. The intrinsic value of human life leads to three corresponding **human** responsibilities:
    - a. **Reckoning**. (Genesis 9:1-6)
      - 1. A responsibility we perform through **civil government**. (Romans 13:1-4)
        - i. In order to better secure **peace**. (I Timothy 2:1-2)
        - ii. And avoid the escalation of **retribution**. (Genesis 4:24)
        - iii. Not all killing is murder.
    - b. **Defense**. (Psalm 82:4)
      - 1. In **policies**, in warnings, or in **actions**. (Exodus 2:16-19, Nehemiah 4:14)
      - 2. But, only commensurate with the **threat**. (Exodus 22:2-3)
    - c. Rescue.
      - 1. Bringing **aid** to human beings in need.
      - 2. Even at the risk of our own lives. (John 15:13)
      - 3. At the **cost** of our time and **resources**. (Matthew 14:14, Luke 10:29-37)
- 5. The more that we come to understand the true **value** of human life and human beings, the more we will:
  - a. Embrace the fullness of what it means to be human ourselves, and
  - **b.** Relate to every other human being in ways that **bless** them and please **God**. (HC, O&A 105-107)
