Major Prophets in Relation to Daniel

Isaiah	153 years before Daniel was taken captive: Warns Judah and Jerusalem of coming judgment for their disobedience to God's Law.	Is 1:1 The vision of Isaiah the son of Amoz, which he saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah.
Jeremiah	Began prophesying 34 years before Daniel was taken captive and continued until the final invasion of Nebuchadnezzar in 586 B.C: He warned of judgment, but also of restoration.	 1:1 The words of Jeremiah the son of Hilkiah, of the priests that were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin: 2 To whom the word of the Lord came in the days of Josiah the son of Amon king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign. 3 It came also in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah king of Judah, unto the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah the son of Josiah king of Judah, unto the carrying away of Jerusalem captive in the fifth month.
Lamentations	Written at the time of the final invasion by Nebuchadnezzar, 588 to 586 B.C.: It is a message mourning the death of the city of Jerusalem, but contains a message of hope mid-way through the book (3:31-33).	All her friends have dealt treacherously with her, they are become her
Ezekiel	Written about eight to ten years after Daniel was taken captive, 597 B.C.: Ezekiel was taken captive at that time. He describes God's glory departing from the Temple. But he concludes with the restoration of God's glory in the millennial temple in Jerusalem.	 1:1 Now it came to pass in the thirtieth year, in the fourth month, in the fifth day of the month, as I was among the captives by the river of Chebar, that the heavens were opened, and I saw visions of God. 2 In the fifth day of the month, which was the fifth year of king Jehoiachin's captivity



Looking to Christ.


