

Servant Thoughts

As I am writing this article, we are receiving a gentle rain that started over night and has lasted through the morning. As dry as we have been, it is not only greatly needed, but also greatly appreciated! Thank you, Lord for Your watering of the earth! What's interesting though is that while on the one hand I was so thankful to see the rain, when I got to the church to begin the week, we discovered two very large leaks in areas that have leaked before, so my excitement for the rain was diminished by finding buckets, setting up fans, emptying buckets and contacting the roof repairman to let them know about the leaks. So, joyful on the one hand, but wishing that there was water dripping into buckets.

I share this because it made me think about our spiritual lives. As dry as things have been, some of the repairs on the roof haven't really been tested, until the rain came. Spiritually, we find ourselves often going through times of spiritual drought, where we know that we should be in the Word of God and let it replenish and refresh us. But for whatever reason, we continue to struggle along spiritually empty. Then something happens, like a great thunderstorm that comes through and reveals the leaks in the roof, something happens in our lives like a tragedy or loss, and it reveals the holes in our spiritual lives... I know it's not a perfect analogy, but it made me realize the importance of ongoing, regular study of God's Word. Even if it's just the Portals of Prayer or a daily devotional through the Lutheran Hour or some other spiritual discipline you have, keeping God's Word as a daily part of your life, allows for Him to pour His spiritual blessings into your life, and allow it to soak in, rather than just leak through in a quick flash flood that does little good, and the spiritual desert returns shortly after. There are probably lots of ways to look at it, but today, I appreciate the rain we've so desperately needed, and appreciate even more, the Word of God which is even more desperately needed.
