Happy August, Peace UCC!

In June, I completed a project for the council and myself that was quite eye opening to all of us that have seen it. I looked back at my hour log I have kept for the past six months with you all and I divided those hours into their respective categories to see where my time has gone. For example, about 45% of my total hours worked with the church has gone into the preparation and presentation of worship services on Sundays, Thursdays, and for funerals. Other categories included committee meetings, special events, pastoral care, and more. Why did I do this? Well, I wanted to get a sense of where my time has been so I could better prepare and prioritize my time for the future and that is what I wanted to write about this month: prioritization.

We all lead very busy lives. I am not an outlier in that equation, I know from talking with many of you how scheduled you all are. There is nothing wrong with this, but it does mean we need to be intentional about where our priorities are. If we don't prioritize certain areas of our lives, then we are more likely to see burnouts happening. For example, working is important. We need money in order to feed our families and put a roof over our heads. But, working so much that we can never have quality time with our families is also an issue. What is the sense of taking care of our families financially if we never get to enjoy being with them in person and whole heartedly? We need to reflect on where our boundaries are and to make different aspects of our lives priorities that are life giving to us and not just ones that help us survive.

I think about this in the context of the greater church life as well. As I am writing this article in the last week of July, we have had to cancel our worship in the park for August. We evaluated how many people had signed up and decided that it was not a priority service on that Sunday. As a church family, we need to evaluate and prioritize what things are important to us. What church events, what theologies, what kinds of services give us the most amount of life? I do strongly believe nature is an important priority to the majority of this congregation, I think this particular Sunday just didn't line up with individual schedules. So, we will try again later this year.

The next step in all of these things is to then stick to those prioritizations. As the council and I discuss where my involvement is best suited, I will need to shift my priorities to those actions. As you discern what areas in your life are most life giving, you will need to shift your priorities which will mean saying no to some things. As this church discerns where its priorities are, we will need to focus in on those things which might mean letting go of some things that are not priorities to us and might mean trying some things that are very new and foreign. Through all

this, however, we walk the journey in community together. So, this month as we begin to enter our busy times of the year again, what are your priorities? Are you living your life according to them already? If not, what can you do to change?

CHARLIE'S RED BARN SEPTEMBER 8, 9, AND 10TH



- 3. Sign into your Faithlife account or create one by providing a valid email address and creating a password.
- 4. Once you're signed in, click on the "Giving" link in the upper right-hand section of the home page.
- 5. Enter the amount you would like to donate and then select where you would like the funds to go from the dropdown list available.
- a. If you would like to donate to two different funds, you don't need to make two separate donations. You can click the button "Add another fund," select the other fund you would like to give to and input a dollar amount for both.
- 6. Click "Next" once you have decided where to send the funds and the dollar amount.
- 7. Now you can designate which family you are giving as, input either a debit card or bank account to draw from and decide if you would like to have this be a recurring gift or a one-time donation.
- 8. You also have the option to cover the processing fee that Faithlife charges by checking the box titled "Cover the processing fees." If this box is not checked, the fees are deducted from your gift to the church.



PEACE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES JUNE 29TH 2022

Members Present-Joel Whitehouse, Bill Harkey, Brenda Maglio, John Meyer, Bob Gehm, and Pastor Uriah ABSENT Bob Smits and Paul Cross

Bill Harkey called meeting to order at 5:30 pm Pastor Uriah led Opening Devotions

Additions to meeting agenda-None

Joel made a motion seconded by John M. to approve May council minutes as printed. Unanimous vote

Pastor's report:

Pastor Uriah and Bob Gehm are continuing the stewardship course

Pastor had 7 mentoring sessions throughout the past month, they are going well.

New member course was held and the new members will be installed on July 10th.

Missions committee is setting up a Hygiene box for Safparc, it was mentioned that we set one up possibly for Sam25 as well.

Pastor would like to hold a meeting with the Sunday school committee to discuss the format that will be used in the fall.

Worship committee will meet in July.

August 7th will be the date for our annual outdoor worship and picnic at Kuckuk park.

Care committee will meet again in July.

Memorial committee met in June and are asking how to help with donations for the on-going projects at the church. We had 2 compassion fund cases.

Member engagement, 1 office visit and 1 phone call were made in June.

Treasurers Report- Joel Reported that there were no outstanding issues with the church's finances during the past month, however he did transfer \$10,000 from our reserves into our checking account to keep things balanced. Kerber-Rose quote came in and it would cost the church an additional \$5,000 annually to handle our bookkeeping. At this time with the recommendation from Joel, council has decided not to pursue this option.

President's Report- Bill reported that the black magic switcher box and Omni microphone have been purchased and we are still waiting on quotes from Raddant Electric for lighting.

We are also still waiting on quotes from Mike Mader for the 2 PTZ cameras as well as associated hardware and software.

Timber Rattlers game will be attended August 11th.

Council held discussion about the Sensory room and came up with new ideas which included a bigger bathroom in the nursery. These ideas will be discussed with Cassandra to get her thoughts.

Council also looked at the sidewalks leading into the church that are shifting and could lead to trip hazards, numerous ideas were discussed to help deal with this issue.

We are still planning our church's 120 year celebration, more details to follow in upcoming meetings.

Charlie's Red Barn event for our church will be held Sept. 8th, 9th, and 10th.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm Closing devotion- The Lord's Prayer. Next Meeting July 27th at 5:30pm. Respectfully submitted by Bob Gehm.
