What's Love got to do with it?

Each Sunday millions of people gather for the purpose of worshipping God. They attend all kinds of churches—big churches, small churches, city churches, country churches. Some meet in multimillion-dollar sanctuaries; some meet in rented facilities. Some have loud worship services; some prefer a contemplative atmosphere. Some churches sing only traditional hymns; others sing contemporary worship choruses. Some preachers wear robes; some don't.

I could go on and on listing the different types of worship services that are taking place right now throughout the country. Despite the many differences, there is one common denominator: millions of Christians have gathered to worship Christ.

All these millions of worshippers fall into two categories: Those who connect with God, and those who simply go through the motions. With very few exceptions, all those in category two really want to be in category one—why else would they be in church? But, for reasons that are beyond them, there are obstacles in their way.

Maybe it's doubt, or confusion, or fear, or unconfessed sin. Whatever the reason, there are many people who go to church hoping to get something out of it, but don't. Instead, week after week they go home feeling empty and bored.

Amazingly, in the very same service there are many who go home exhilarated, knowing that they have been in the presence of the living God. I have heard said, "This is one of the greatest worship experiences I've ever had!" Moments later to hear, "This was not for me this morning!" It was hard to believe both people were in the same worship service.

The most important element in any worship service is the heart of the person attending the service. If your heart is bent toward God when you walk in the door—it will be full of God when you walk out.

Jesus said, "those who worship God must worship in spirit and truth." Worship can be defined as "getting drenched with God." It can happen anytime you want; it's simply a matter of preparing yourself. Take a moment to read this passage: Isaiah 6:1-8

Worship begins with an attitude of reverence—or respect—for God. We cannot refer to Him flippantly as "the big guy" or "the man upstairs." He's not an impersonal "higher power." He is God—great, powerful, good, and worthy of our praise.

There are two sides to God's nature. On one side is the transcendence of God, the fact that God is beyond anything earthly or finite. On the other side is the immanence of God, the fact God is everywhere all the time. These are two extremes, and both are true.

Psalm 138:6 says, "For though the Lord is high, he regards the lowly."

There's an old hymn that says, "He walks with me and talks with me and tells me I am His own." This is the immanence of God. It is true, but we sometimes make the mistake of ignoring the other side of God's nature. We fail to acknowledge His holiness, His majesty, His power.

Some theologians have described God with the phrase "wholly other", meaning that God is not one of us, nor is He like us. He is beyond anything we could imagine, greater than we comprehend, more magnificent than we could ever describe.

He is good beyond description, powerful beyond description, holy beyond description. He is completely independent of this world, and His involvement with humanity is purely by choice—not the result of any need or limitation on His part. He is Wholly Other.

Isaiah recognized this side of God when he saw the Lord. He was overcome with an awareness of God's...

Majesty - "I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty…" Greatness - "…and the hem of his robe filled the temple…" Supremacy - "…Angels were in attendance above him…" Holiness - "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts…" Glory - "…the whole earth is full of His glory."

Worship begins with the right attitude about God. As far as is humanly possible, we must see Him as He really is—powerful, holy, pure, and good. This leads us to the next part of worship. Worship is more than just singing a few songs and listening to a sermon. It is more than just following a ritual. Worship is an attitude that says, "Here am I, Lord, send me!"

When two people get married, they publicly vow to love, honor, and cherish one another until they are parted by death. The success of the marriage is dependent upon the couple's commitment to this vow.

It doesn't matter how much money was spent on the ceremony; it doesn't matter what was the color of the bridesmaid's dress; it makes no difference how many people were in attendance. These are all irrelevant: the wedding ceremony is not the marriage.

If the bride and groom aren't serious about the wedding vow, then the whole event is a charade and a waste of everybody's time, because a good marriage is not determined by a fancy wedding ceremony, it is determined by the level of commitment the bride and groom have for one another.

In the same way, the music, the prayers, the scripture reading, and the message you have heard today are all only "pomp and circumstance" if you leave without a stronger commitment to serve God. Paul said, "I appeal to you therefore, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." (Romans 12:1)

Considering our conversation today, please keep this in mind as you go to worship God this week, ask yourself this... am I bringing Him my real and am I bringing him my all?


Crosswalk

So I was working my day job earlier this week and I noticed something odd. I watched a couple exit a business on 6th St and approach the curb line at mid-block where they stood and waited for several minutes for traffic to pass before stepping out into the street to try to cross all four lanes before traffic picked back up again. Neither of them could move very quickly for what I assumed were health reasons and I watched them try to hurry across the street, forcing approaching cars to wait for them to get across. Now the funny thing about this is that not thirty yards from where they crossed is a pedestrian crosswalk, complete with a push-button traffic signal that when activated, requires traffic to stop and let them cross at their own pace. The presence of this crosswalk, technically makes what they did jaywalking and illegal, fortunately for them, I was too busy coming up with this devotion and watching to make sure they got across safely to stop them for said violation. So rather than put in a little extra effort to do things the way things should be done, they took the "easy" route and ended up costing themselves a lot of time and risk. Thankfully they were able to get safely across, but was it worth it?

This got me thinking, how often in our lives do we try to do things our own way? How often do we try to take the "easy" route instead of listening to God's word and direction and face life's problems and our day to day situation the way we should? We try to lean on our own understanding and face issues with our own stiff necked plans when, if we'd just take a minute and look around, so to speak, if we would just take a minute to take our circumstances before the Lord and seek His path and His council, how much heartache and effort could we save ourselves?

So I encourage you all as I encourage myself, when you're up against something; whether it's a major life decision or crisis, or you just need a little direction, take the time to go to the Lord. Walk that half a block to the "cross" walk and just push the button.

a message from OUR ELDERS

Greetings from the elders!

"Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." \sim 1 Timothy 4:12

Paul's encouragement to Timothy should be a challenge to all of us who... let's say... are less youthful than we used to be. Do we see our youth as examples? From the perspective of this elder, we can absolutely learn from our youth and the way God shows up in their lives. I had the privilege of accompanying the Central Park Christian Church high school youth to the CIY Move conference in Arlington, Texas during the week of July 11th. These high school kids' depth of knowledge, their wisdom, and their willingness to have hard conversations was inspiring and humbling. We can certainly learn from their example of faith and conduct in love. I hope you all took the opportunity to hear our youth speak on July 24th for Youth Sunday. This is being written before Youth Sunday, but I am sure there will have been wisdom and encouragement shared by our youth that should spur our congregation to greater faith in Christ. There is a reputation within the church that we do not show up for Youth Sunday. That reputation needs to be overcome. I would encourage you to get to know the kids in our church. Volunteer to help out with youth and children's events. Be an example to them and, maybe more importantly, let them be an example to you. God is using them to spread His glory in Topeka and beyond.

In other elder news, the elders are working to revamp the oversight of the various ministries at Central Park Christian Church. This does not affect any staff positions or supervisory structure, but the elders believe we can be more effective overseers with some changes. While this is still in the discussion stage, the plan is to have each elder oversee a specific set of ministries. This will allow the elders to be more informed and provide a direct line of communication between the ministries and church leadership. We are continuing to monitor the financial health of the church as well. Giving has been below projections and, as we've all noticed, prices for nearly everything have gone up significantly. Stewardship of the resources God has provided continue to be top of mind and we trust His provision.

God is doing big things at CPCC and we are excited that He allows us to be a part of His story.

HIGHLIGHTED CHILDREN - SHENSY AND LAYSA!




