

Final Words and a Beautiful Blessing

2 Corinthians 13:11-14 July 31, 2022

<u>The Big Idea</u>: After a lengthy and often contentious series of challenges, Paul ends with words of tenderness, love, and encouragement. He also prays for them through a benediction that calls on all three persons of our triune God.

2 Corinthians 13:11-14 (ESV)

13 ¹¹ Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. ¹² Greet one another with a holy kiss. ¹³ All the saints greet you.

¹⁴The grace of the *Lord Jesus Christ* and the love of *God* and the fellowship of the *Holy Spirit* be with you all.

5 IMPERATIVES – EVIDENCE OF GOD'S WORK IN OUR LIVES:

- 1. Rejoice [Philippians 4:4]
- 2. Mature/grow in your walk with Jesus [Ephesians 3:14-19]
- 3. Exhort, encourage, submit [1 Thessalonians 5:11]
- 4. Unity around Biblical Truth [Philippians 2:2; 4:2]

5. Be at peace [Romans 12:18]

A BONUS COMMAND:

→ Greet one another with warmth and sincerity

KNOW THE GOD TO WHOM WE PRAY:

- God (The Father) [Ephesians 4:6]

KNOW THE PARTICULAR WORKS OF BLESSINGS EACH ONE PRODUCES IN GOD'S PEOPLE:

- ✓ GRACE charis the absolutely free expression of God's lovingkindness; also, joy!
- ✓ LOVE agape God's willful choice to give us what we need, not necessarily what we want [John 3:16]
- ✓ FELLOWSHIP koinonia the act of participating at a deep level in the privileges of relationships, especially of marriage and church.

Let's admit that we are not enough, and turn to the God who is.
