Dear Friends,



This month will see one of the biggest changes of our lives – our only child heads off to college, 577 miles away.

Looking back, to say I felt ill-prepared for fatherhood would be an understatement. There had been no other children in my family, and my exposure to children of any age in my early adulthood was sparse at best. Even though we were 31 when Jacob entered the world, I think I had only held, at most, three infants in my life, at all. (I had certainly never changed a diaper!)

However, as with countless other unprepared fathers before me, I learned and I figured it out. Beyond the survival basics of raising a child, though, I had even bigger worries. How does one raise a little boy in the 21st century?

This is far from a silly question, and its one we need to be asking as a society. I always point out to folks in the church that the childhood Brooke and I experienced is far more like that experienced by our most senior members than what Jacob and his generation have known. Technology and culture have changed far more from the '70s to the '00s than they did from the '30s and '40s to the '70s. And because of that, for many adults in the church today, how to raise our children is a timeless question that has taken on a new immediacy.

I maintain that despite changing times and changing social morals, a major tool for raising children continues to be keeping them in the church. When a church acts as it should, every person in that church becomes an extended part of a child's family. Every church-aunt and church-uncle, every church-grandparent, watches over, teaches, and nurtures each child in the church and encourages them to look past their troubled culture and see the one true God who loves them.

Matthew 18 says, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." It is a priority and a command that each local church welcome children in the name of Jesus Christ. We have been blessed that throughout Jacob's life, he has known churches like this, which took this responsibility seriously.

As Jacob prepares to head out into the world and begin this next phase in life, we are proud of the values he has learned and grateful that he had such a wonderful church family from which to learn them. Thank you all for truly being our "church family."

New Business: Marci Welliever had cleaned the outdoor church sign and said in the future the woman might want to start saving to help purchase a new sign. (hopefully a digital one) The west side of the sign is faded and the grooves for the letters cannot be cleaned completely. It was also suggested to reserve some money to help with members attending the Christian retreat at the Cove in Ashville, North Carolina.

We need to stand firm in our faith (1 Cor. 16:13) and keep the threefold objective when reconciling differences: restoration, faith, and keeping Christ in our hearts.
