# The Kings of Neo-Babylonia

King	Dates B.C.	Scripture	Comments
<b>Nebuchadnezzar</b>	605-562	2 Kings 24:24-25; Daniel 1-4	Ruled 43 years before his death.
<b>Evil-Merodach</b>	562-560	2 Kings 25:27-30; Jeremiah 52:31-34	Murdered by Neriglissar.
<b>Neriglissar</b>	560-556	Jeremiah 39:3,13	Died.
<b>Labahi-Marduk</b> (Son of Neriglissar)	556	-	Assassinated by Nabonidus.
<b>Nabonidus</b>	556-539	-	-
<b>Belshazzar</b> (Son of Nabonidus)	???-539	Daniel 5,7,8	Killed by Darius the Mede.

2	Interpreting Nebuchadnezzar's 1 <sup>st</sup> dream (huge image)	17
3	Daniel's 3 friends cast into the fiery furnace	Early 40's
4	Interpreting Nebuchadnezzar's 2nd dream (huge tree)	50's
5	Interpreting handwriting of the wall at Belshazzar's feast	Early 80's
6	Delivered from the den of lions	Early 80's
7-8	Daniel's visions and dreams (not chronological)	Mid-60's
9	Daniel's seventy "sevens" prophecy	Early-80's
10-12	Final dreams and visions	Mid-80's

Breast and Arms of Silver - **Media-Persian Empire**

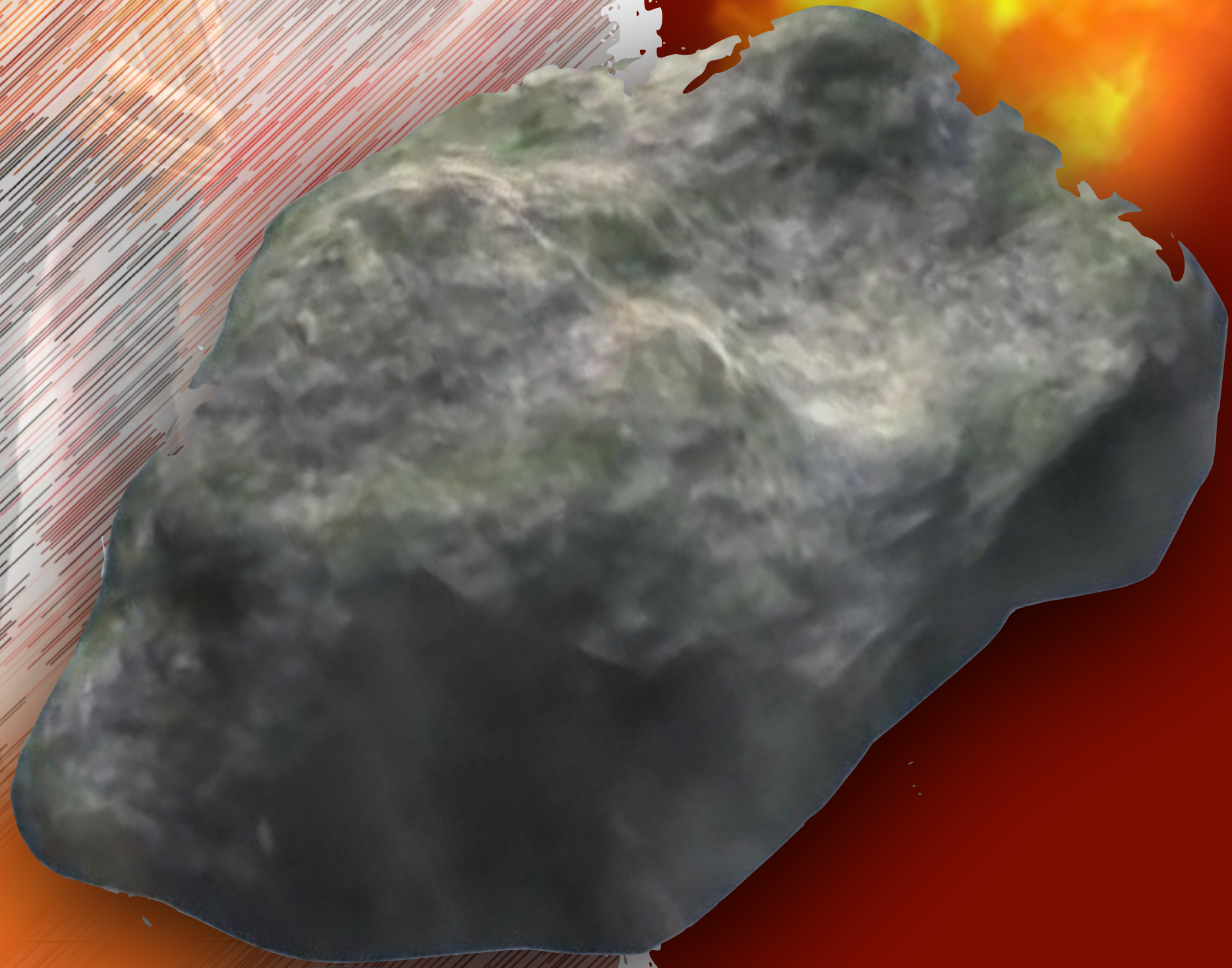
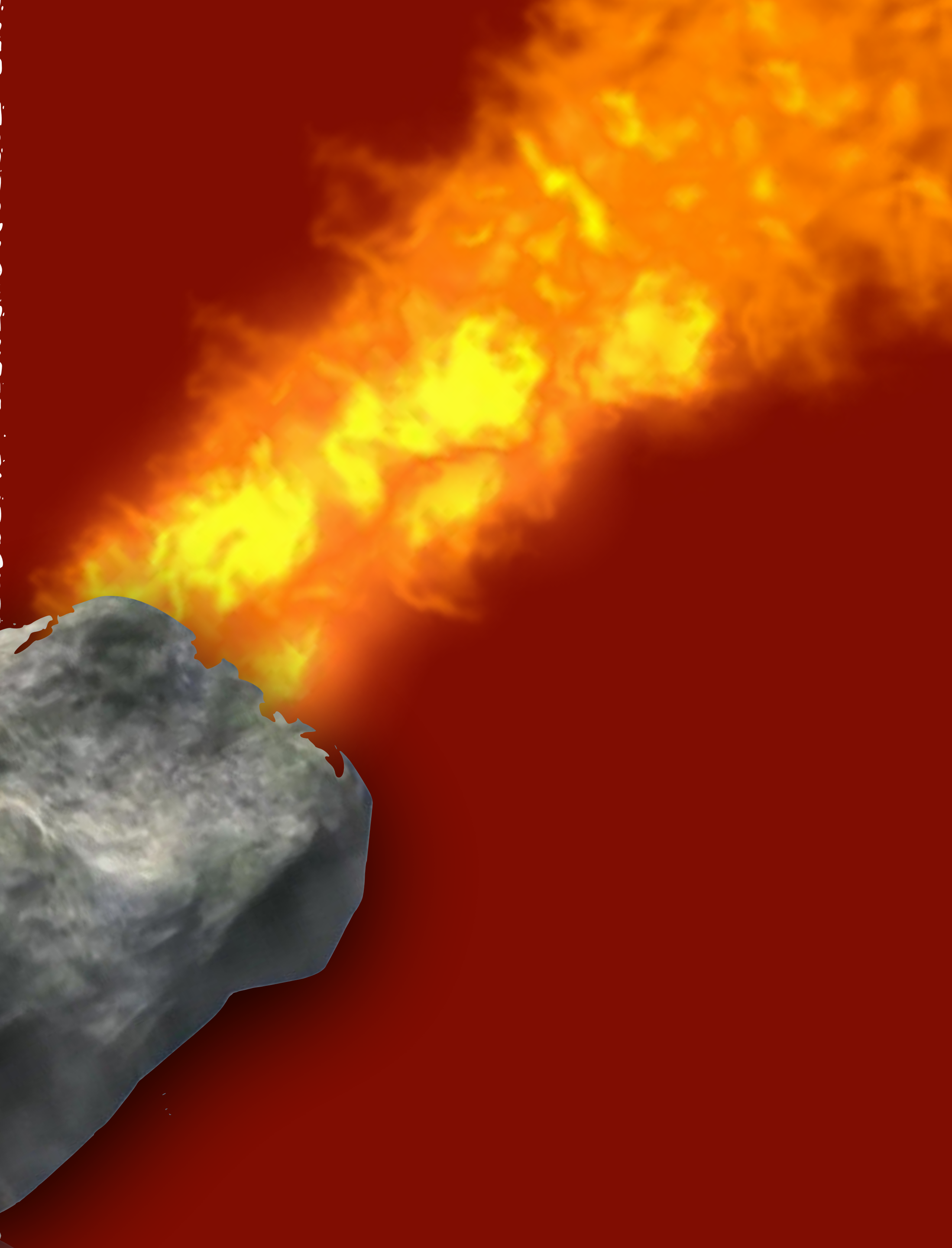
Belly and Thighs of Brass - **Greek/Macedon Empire**

# Characteristics of the Man Daniel

A man of purpose.	He resolved not to defile himself with the things of the world.
A man of prayer.	His prayers will be a great example for us.
A man of prophecy.	His book is the key that unlocks the predictions of other prophets.
A man of integrity.	He was above reproach which made him open for attack; but he was so morally and ethically consistent his attackers could not find a single flaw.



# Major Prophets in Relation to Daniel

<h2>Isaiah</h2>	<p>153 years before Daniel was taken captive: Warns Judah and Jerusalem of coming judgment for their disobedience to God's Law.</p>	<p>Is 1:1 The vision of Isaiah the son of Amoz, which he saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah.</p>
<h2>Jeremiah</h2>	<p>Began prophesying 34 years before Daniel was taken captive and continued until the final invasion of Nebuchadnezzar in 586 B.C.: He warned of judgment, but also of restoration.</p>	<p>1:1 The words of Jeremiah the son of Hilkiyah, of the priests that were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin: 2 To whom the word of the Lord came in the days of Josiah the son of Amon king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign. 3 It came also in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah king of Judah, unto the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah the son of Josiah king of Judah, unto the carrying away of Jerusalem captive in the fifth month.</p>
<h2>Lamentations</h2>	<p>Written at the time of the final invasion by Nebuchadnezzar, 588 to 586 B.C.: It is a message mourning the death of the city of Jerusalem, but contains a message of hope mid-way through the book (3:31-33).</p>	<p>1:1 How doth the city sit solitary, that was full of people! How is she become as a widow! she that was great among the nations, And princess among the provinces, how is she become tributary! 2 She weepeth sore in the night, and her tears are on her cheeks: Among all her lovers she hath none to comfort her: All her friends have dealt treacherously with her, they are become her enemies. 3 Judah is gone into captivity because of affliction, and because of great servitude:</p>
<h2>Ezekiel</h2>	<p>Written about eight to ten years after Daniel was taken captive, 597 B.C.: Ezekiel was taken captive at that time. He describes God's glory departing from the Temple. But he concludes with the restoration of God's glory in the millennial temple in Jerusalem.</p>	<p>1:1 Now it came to pass in the thirtieth year, in the fourth month, in the fifth day of the month, as I was among the captives by the river of Chebar, that the heavens were opened, and I saw visions of God. 2 In the fifth day of the month, which was the fifth year of king Jehoiachin's captivity...</p>

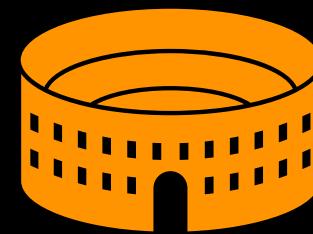
# The Divine Plan of the Gospel

Man, made in God's image is given dominion over all of creation.



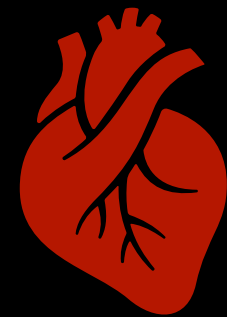

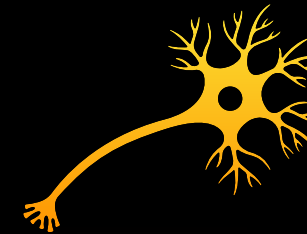

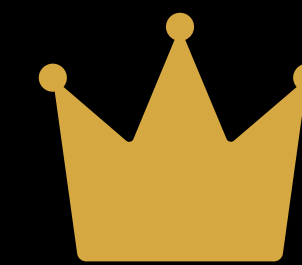
