

From the Voice Bible, Matthew 14:22-32 (See also, Mark 6:47-52 and John 6:19)

²⁴The boat was in the water, some distance from land, buffeted and pushed around by waves and wind. 25Deep in the night, when He had concluded His prayers, Jesus walked out on the water to His disciples in their boat. 26The disciples saw a figure moving toward them and were terrified.

Disciple: It's a ghost!

Another Disciple: A ghost? What will we do?

Jesus: ²⁷Be still. It is I. You have nothing to fear.

Peter: ²⁸Lord, if it is really You, then command me to meet You on the water.

Fund for Leaders

Twenty-five years ago, at the 1997 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, leaders of our church presented a case for establishing what we now know as the ELCA Fund for Leaders and challenged the church to make a robust commitment to theological education for its future leaders. In 2000 the Fund for Leaders awarded its first eight scholarships. Now, the Fund for Leaders supports over 300 candidates for ministry with over \$3.2 million in scholarships. Including synodical scholarship recipients, the Fund for Leaders network of alums has grown to over a thousand!

We will celebrate the Fund for Leaders all year with new stories from alums, new resources and the first in-person scholarship award banquet since 2019. We will also continue to grow the Fund for Leaders. The fund is providing \$1 million more in scholarship support annually than it was five years ago. With your help, we hope to increase our annual awards by another \$1 million in the next five years. That will allow us to give 50 full-tuition scholarships to promising leaders every year.

Together, we are working toward our ultimate goal: a future in which every ELCA seminary candidate can graduate without the burden of financial debt.

Shield A Badge With Prayer Ministry

Central Lutheran Church, along with other churches and organizations in the area are being invited

to renew their participation in the "Shield a Badge" support ministry. Volunteers sign up to pray daily for a member of the Casa Grande Police Department praying for their safety and wellbeing. The coordinator for Central Lutheran Church is Sandy Carpenter and she can be reached via e-mail: <u>carpesm56@gmail.com</u>.

Even if you have signed up in the past, we have been given an updated listing of badge numbers so you will need to sign up again. If you would like to volunteer to pray for a police officer or one of the police chaplains (there are three) please contact Sandy and she will assign you an officer's badge number or chaplain number. You have two ways of signing up: email Sandy or go to the CLC app and there is a signup sheet you can fill out and Sandy will contact you with a badge number. The commitment is to pray daily for the safety and well-being of the officer for one year. Only the officer's badge number is provided to the volunteer (no names or personal information is provided). A participant may choose to correspond with an officer, by badge number, through the Casa Grande Police Department's mailing system at 373 E Val Vista Blvd, Casa Grande, AZ 85122. Please feel free to contact Sandy with any additional questions you may have about the ministry.

Quilting Wednesdays

Although the quilters are not meeting during the summer, they are still planning for when they meet again in the fall. The quilters do not send their quilts to Lutheran World Relief, but they provide them locally, thus their mission is to reach out with quilts to such places as:

Eloy and Casa Grande Police, Nursing Services, Assisted Living facilities, Oasis rehabilitation, Indian reservations and many other locations,



The quilters are looking to move all of their supplies out of the old kitchen in Arizona City, to the Fellowship Hall. In doing so, there is a significant ex-

pense. They need to purchase or construct cabinets to hold their fabric, cuttings tools, yarns, sewing machines, iron, ironing boards and large rolls of batting.

The Spiritual Corner

Matthew 7: 1-5 (Voice translation)

7 Jesus: If you judge other people, then you will find that you, too, are being judged. ² Indeed, you will be judged by the very standards to which you hold other people.

So when someone is tempted to criticize his neighbor because her house isn't clean enough, she seems ill-tempered, or she is a bit flighty—he should remember those same standards and judgments will come back to him. No one should criticize his neighbor for being short-tempered one morning, when he is snippish and snappish and waspish all the time.

Jesus: ³ Why is it that you see the dust in your brother's or sister's eye, but you can't see what is in your own eye? ⁴ Don't ignore the wooden plank in your eye, while you criticize the speck of sawdust in your brother's eyelashes. ⁵ That type of criticism and judgment is a sham! Remove the plank from your own eye, and then perhaps you will be able to see clearly how to help your brother flush out his sawdust.

'Beware of starting out strong, and then getting sidetracked from your real purpose LOVING GOD AND LIVING FOR HIM' NLT bible study bible

- While this whole passage is very clear, why do we still feel we have the right to judge anyone or anything? Yes, I am speaking of myself and I'm calling you out too. Yes, this is harsh, but do a self-check. I am not immune to this selfcheck; I'm doing that now. <u>Don't let someone</u> judgment you made of another keep you from loving all, including the one you judged.
- How many times have you looked at someone and judged their lifestyle choice, the food they eat, books they read, music they listen to and yes even make-up, hair styles and clothes?
- Just because we don't agree with someone, or something we should never judge them. We are called to love everyone. We are here to help each other learn how to stay on track; LOVING GOD AND LIVING FOR HIM.

Look in the mirror and do a self-check daily and let's learn how to love and show kindness to all. Come to church and worship with your fellow Christian family, serve and grow. With God we never stop growing. By coming to worship, with your Christian Family and serving, you are taking part in the marks of Discipleship of, Weekly Worship, Service and Spiritual Friendship.

Father God, thank you! Thank you for forgiving me for the judgments I make. Help me forgive those who judge me. Help me to turn to you before I pass judgment on another. Help me love as Jesus did and live for you. **Amen**

Heard and Seen

In July, we were able to do some improvements to our online offering for worship services. You should find that the sound has improved, the camera views and the overall clarity has improved. You can also see the worship slides, directly in the video as we stream the service. Even since putting in the new system, which was about \$20,000 less than what it looked like we were having to put in, there have been improvements and we still need some more.

Can you help? One of the Marks of Discipleship is giving. Giving of time and money. I guess that really comes out to Service and Giving, both marks of discipleship. We need people to help run the streaming. This is easy to teach, easy to do, no previous experience needed. It would also be helpful to have one or two people willing to adjust cameras during a worship.

We need to improve the overall sound. Although it is better, it needs more help. To do so, we need donations above and beyond what people are giving now, to be directed to the streaming fund. We need more tripods for the cell phone cameras that we use. We also need ambient microphones at both sites, to capture people singing, the piano and when people respond in those assembled. Additionally, we need more microphones to help capture the band singing and so even those assembled can hear. Please consider a donation to the streaming fund, either online or by writing in the memo on a check or your giving envelope.

... heeding fear? ³²Then

Jesus and Peter climbed in the boat together, and the wind became still. ³³And the disciples worshiped Him.

Disciples: Truly You are the Son of God.

Peter walked on water; all he did was go towards Jesus when he commanded him to. The other 11, cowered in the boat during the storm, but Peter took a chance that he could do fantastic things, in Jesus. Can you? Will you? Do you want to?

Peter asked to be commanded. He said he wanted to go to Jesus. Jesus made it possible. Peter walked on water, because he wanted to, he was willing and unlike the others, he got out of the boat.

Yes, the disciple named Peter also began to sink. He took his eyes off Jesus and realized just what he was doing, and fear overcomes him. Jesus did not abandon Peter, he saves Peter. Just how he has saved us and will save us. As follows of Jesus, we are called disciples. Jesus asks us to be His disciples. We are finishing up Power Surge: Six Marks of Discipleship. There is something that is not a mark of discipleship, but it is crucial to begin the walk.

Are you willing? Do you want to be a spectator? Do you want to be served while others do all the work of being a disciple? Are you willing to respond to the love of God for us in Jesus? Then it is time to get out of the boat and walk on water. Learn more and sign-up for the class ASAP. The first 20 will get a spot, but you MUST sign up. Be spiritual friends (a mark of discipleship) to each other and help other disciples to get to the class. There will be Bible reading, also a mark of Discipleship. Invite others from outside of the congregation, all are encouraged and welcome to come.


