Message from the Chair

July was a quiet month for Churches Together. Many people were away on holiday. It was a natural break in our activities, after a year in which we gradually returned to life as normal following the pandemic. It was also an opportunity for reflection: how can Churches Together best serve our member churches and communities as we prepare for another year? Do our current activities remain valid and useful? Is there anything we need to change?

Times of rest from activity enable us to focus on what really matters. I am reminded that the work of prayer supports and sustains everything we do. A previous Archbishop of Canterbury, William Temple, observed: "The right relation between prayer and conduct is not that conduct is supremely important and prayer may help it, but that prayer is supremely important and conduct tests it."

The monthly Prayer Breakfasts bring us together in a time of fellowship to thank God for his goodness and seek his direction as we plan for the future. The numbers attending vary, but there were not many at all at the July event. In a sense, quantum doesn't matter ("For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them" – Matthew 18:20), but we are missing an opportunity if we stay away. The next Prayer Breakfast is on Saturday 24 September and it would be good to see more people there.

Contemplative prayer, also known as Christian meditation, or the prayer of quiet, is a different kind of prayer and is not something we currently offer in Godalming. I would like to start a contemplative prayer group in September if there is enough interest. More details at the end of this edition of Link Up.

Returning to the programme, our next activity is the Worship in the Park service at Godalming Bandstand at 10.30am on Sunday 14 August. This is at the end of the Staycation week of activities. This enables us to come together in a public act of worship and to witness to the local community. The Cellar Café will be open for refreshments after the service. We do need some help of various kinds to make the event run smoothly, so if anyone is able to act as a steward, please let me know in the next few days.

Godalming Minster

On Monday 11 July 2022 the PCCs of Busbridge Church, Hambledon Church and St Peter and Paul with St Mark's Churches voted on the proposal to unite and become a Minster Parish for the Godalming and wider area.

The PCC members are the Trustees of their parishes, so the matter was taken seriously, and they all spent considerable time in thought, preparation and prayer.

Now the Minster proposal has been passed by all PCCs by a clear individual and collective majority, there will be meetings over the coming weeks for all church members where details of the proposal will be fully explored with lots of opportunities for questions. We will also gather for more prayer times.

In the Autumn the PCCs' decision will be brought to special Archdeacon's APCMs across all the parishes for further prayer and ratification.

The Julian Meetings

The Julian Meetings:

- Foster the teaching and practice of contemplative prayer and meditation in the Christian tradition.
- Encourage people to practise contemplative prayer and meditation in their daily lives, and to explore ways of doing this which are appropriate for them.
- Support the individual ecumenical Julian Meetings groups who meet regularly to practise Christian contemplative prayer and meditation together.

A Julian Meeting is usually 6–15 people of various denominations, both lay people and clergy. They meet regularly in a house, church or chapel. A brief reading, or piece of music, leads into about 30 minutes of silent contemplative prayer. This may be followed by a time for tea or

coffee and conversation. The ethos is to keep things simple. There is no fixed leadership, and as little administration as possible. They are free of charge.

The Julian Meetings movement was named after Julian of Norwich, a fourteenth century mystic. Her writings are sometimes used at meetings but JM is not associated with other organisations bearing her name – or indeed with any particular denomination.

What is contemplative prayer?

Contemplative prayer has been described as listening for God; opening ourselves to God; waiting silently upon God. Other descriptions are meditation, contemplation, centring prayer or 'the prayer of quiet'. In contemplative prayer we seek to be aware of the presence of God and to remain silently and attentively in that presence, completely open to God. It is not just that words are unnecessary, but that they may even get in the way. Prayer involves listening as well as speaking, but so often we do all the talking and God doesn't get a chance to talk to us! Simply 'being with God' like this is a very natural way of praying. It may be the only way we can pray when we're tired or ill. Some children pray in this way quite instinctively. So did the old man who explained why he sat in church for hours: 'I look at Him, He looks at me.'

Why join a Julian Meeting?

If we feel we need to learn how to be still with God, we might start with ways that have helped other people. Belonging to a group of people who meet regularly to pray in silence can both help and encourage us. We do not feel isolated. Prayerful silence is helped when two or three are together, and this complements our daily personal prayer. If we are having problems with our praying, sharing them can help us to grow through them. A Julian Meeting can provide these opportunities.

What next?

I would like to start a Julian Meeting in Godalming if enough people are interested. This would start in September, meeting once a month, on a Tuesday afternoon or evening depending on what suited those attending.

The meeting would be held in the Lady Chapel at St John the Evangelist, Farncombe, by kind permission of the Rector and PCC.
