HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *How Firm a Foundation.* In Hebrews 11:1, faith is defined as, "The assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." It is easy to trust what you can see; it is difficult to have such a deep conviction of an unseen thing that you would spend your life pursuing it. Yet, that is what we do as Christians. We pursue our Savior; we look for the resurrection of the dead; we say that heaven is our home. Have we seen any of these things? No. But even though we have not seen them, we have the conviction that they are real because of God's Word. God will not lie to us, so we pursue the unseen things above with full conviction that we will find them. Anyone who builds on God's Word in this way has a firm foundation.

A WORD: The theme for this Sunday is faith, and as we learn from our epistle lesson, "faith is assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Abraham shows us what true faith is like when God promises him a son. This is an unseen thing, but "Abram believed God, and He counted it to him as righteousness." That is faith. The conviction of an unseen thing. Jesus also teaches us about faith in our Gospel lesson. The birds do not worry about what they will eat. They trust God to provide. That is faith. In the same way, we are not to be anxious about what we can see. God will take care of our lives in this world. But from the conviction that God will care for us and that he desires to give us heaven, we are to pursue the kingdom of God. That is faith.
