2. What do we know about that time in Israel's history?
3. To whom were Isaiah's words directed? (1:2,4; 2:1; 32:9; 59:12-13;)
4. How might 2 Timothy 3:16-17 connect us to the book of Isaiah?
5. What genre is Isaiah? (Old Testament History, Prophetic Literature, Wisdom Literature, Apocalyptic Literature, Gospels, Epistle)
6. Is Isaiah's writing discourse, narrative, or poetry? What then should we expect to find in this book?
7. Describe Isaiah's call to service? (6:1-8a; 20:1-2)
8. What was Isaiah's response to God's call? (6:8b; 20:3)
9. Have you ever sensed God's call to do/go/say something? What was your first response? Then what?

10. How might Isaiah 1:18 apply to any generation of people?

11. Is 10:1-2 a sentiment from the Lord only for Isaiah's time? Why?
