HYMN OF THE DAY: Our epistle reading reminds us to fix our eyes on Jesus as we run the race of faith. Our hymn of the day, *I Love to Tell the Story*, helps us to do just that. The story of the Gospel satisfies the longings of all who believe it. It promises us richer blessings than all our golden dreams. It is a story that becomes more wonderful as we repeat it to ourselves year after year. Why? Because it is the true story of God's love for us in Jesus Christ.

A WORD: Our theme for this Sunday is God's Word. Our Gospel reading shows us the power of God's Word as Jesus reminds us that his Word is like fire. It purifies those who believe in him by cleansing them from sin. It destroys those who reject him by condemning them for their sin. The Old Testament reading warns us that not everyone who claims to speak for God is faithful to God's Word. There are many false prophets who would lead us away from God to our own harm by filling us with vain hope. Therefore, we must remain anchored in what we know is true, the Word of God. That is where we find true hope and true salvation. Our epistle lesson encourages us to lay aside the sin that entangles us and to run the race of faith by fixing our eyes on Christ.
