

THAT TIME OF YEAR

I guess it's that time of year, because before you know it we'll be planning Advent and Christmas again! (Which, of course, nobody wants to hear about at this point!)

How does this happen? How does time go by so quickly?

I know that for me, in the life of the church, I usually measure time by the ministry and program year. What event/s am I or are we getting ready for? How much time do I have between these particular events? I know that many of you measure time the same way: seasons of farming, the school year, work patterns, volunteer seasons, etc.

But after so long of that, it sure can get tiring.

While there is usually no getting around these kinds of tasks and seasons, and the patterns and rhythms that shape our lives, I think

we're called to see a bigger picture. We are to ask ourselves why we are doing these things. What calling from God makes these calendar items so important? Thinking about the why in all of this certainly helps ground us into our daily and seasonal tasks.

But I think we're also called to see a bigger pattern in our life: the one of six days of work followed by a day of rest. Sabbath. God took a day off, so why can't we? And this doesn't always mean taking Sunday off. As long as one of the seven days is designated as a day of rest for us that is our calling as God's children. I fully confess that I am not good at it, even after my experience sabbatical. But I think living the way God created us to live can truly bring us so much new life.

So, here's to a not so busy fall! (And the church responds, yea right!)




