COMING FULL CIRCLE

Twenty-five years ago, we arrived in Colorado with two small boys in tow to begin pre-field training for serving as bi-vocational missionaries in an East Asian country closed to traditional missionary work. LBIM had called us to go to that country after a gap of nearly fifty years since the last LB missionaries had been forced to leave the country due to war. A fledgling church had already been established in the country through the efforts of earlier missionaries, evangelists and pastors, but countless millions still remained untouched by the gospel. We would be part of a new wave of bi-vocational Christians flooding into this "closed" country from other nations to live out our Christian faith in the workplace, on university campuses, in our neighborhoods, and in our homes.

And now, as we write this farewell reflection for the DPN, we find ourselves back in Colorado—this time to attend a week-long missionary retreat that will bring our time of service in our beloved East Asian country to a formal end. Because of the global pandemic, we have been "locked out" of our home in East Asia for the past two-and-a-half years and are now relocating back to the US—to Fergus Falls, Minnesota, the place where we first met each other and began dating as students at Lutheran Brethren Schools back in the mid-1980s.

As we have been thinking back this week on our decades of service in East Asia, our hearts are filled with gratitude to the Lord for giving us a front-row seat to watch him moving and working in powerful, life-giving ways in that particular arena over the past twenty-five years. We are grateful for:

- each of the 1000+ undergraduate students and 100+ post-graduate students that attended Joel's university courses.
- the 500+ Bibles (subsidized by funds from LBIM) that were purchased by university students and staff during those years.
- the many that have studied the Bible, professed faith in Christ, received baptism, chosen to marry Christian spouses and begin Christian families, and entered into or launched Christian outreach ministries.
- the many training events that we have been able to facilitate for disability ministries, marriage enrichment, ministry team formation, seminary training, teacher training, new missionary orientation, missionary care, and emerging mission leaders.
- The many short-term teams from the US and Europe that we have been privileged to welcome, lead, and host.
- The many creative, Spirit-led local ministries that have sprung up to bring the hope of the gospel to people with HIV, children with disabilities, earthquake victims, unreached people groups, and trafficked women.
- The hundreds of Christian co-workers—both local and international—that
 we have been privileged to know and serve alongside of during our time
 overseas.

As we say good-bye to our East Asia-based ministry years and say hello to the US-based ministry years ahead of us at Lutheran Brethren Seminary (Joel) and LBIM (Liz), we look forward to seeing God work just as powerfully and graciously all around us. The circle may look complete in bringing us back to Colorado and Fergus Falls, but our eternal journey with an awesome, gracious God is just getting started!
