

Spirituality and Stewardship

It may seem counter intuitive that Stewardship could be a Spiritual practice. Before we

go there, it is important to understand the biblical practice of Stewardship. Even before that, we need to examine Stewardship and Tithing, which go hand in hand.

Merriam-Webster defines stewardship as:

1: the office, duties, and obligations of a <u>steward</u>

2: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something *especially*: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care

What is a steward? Again from Merriam-Webster:

1: one employed in a large household or estate to manage domestic concerns

God appoints us as stewards of all God has created. From Gen 1:28 (The Voice) ²⁸Then God blessed them and gave them *this directive*: "Be fruitful and multiply. Populate the earth. *I make you trustees of My estate,* so care for My creation and rule over the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, and every creature that roams across the earth."

A Trustee is a person that entrusted to property to administer it for the benefit of another. You can interchange trustee and steward and therefore, we are trustees/stewards of the house God created, all of the world and all that is in it. Taking that deeper, that means all we have is not ours, but God's, given on loan. We have been given a charge, a calling to manage what God has given, if that is not Spiritual enough, God gives directions all through the Bible, on what that looks like.

Stewardship does involve physical property, that which God gave us. But it also involves things such as sharing the Word of God with others. Think of the Great commission, Matthew 28:19-20.

A Tithe is a tenth of something, but more specifically it refers giving back to God a tenth of what God has given us, everything. Can you see the Spirituality? Maybe you don't like to be asked for or ask of others, on behalf of God?

Stewardship is referenced in: 1 Chronicles, Psalms, Luke, 1 Peter, Ephesians, Colossians, and Matthew.

Tithing is referenced in: Genesis, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, 2 Chronicles, Nehemiah, Amos, Malachi, Tobit, Judith, Sirach, 1 Maccabees, Matthew, Luke, and Hebrews.

If that is you or you want to learn more, there is a great study coming up. It is being led by Pastor Doug and Pastor Miguel from the Grand Canyon Synod.

Mark 10:45

"He came to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many people"

I have a tough question for you. Who and how do you serve?

At the conclusion of the sermon series The Six Marks of Discipleship, what role (s) have you taken up?

If you don't want a bird to fly you clip it's wings. It them becomes dependent on you to care for them, providing food, shelter and keeping them safe.

If you want the bird to fly free, their wings are not clipped, so they continue to fly high. This now allows them to explore, learn, grow, and keep themselves fed and happy.

Treasurer Update


Hello fellow Central Lutheran's. We are almost through our endless summer here in Arizona and are all looking forward to the cooler fall temperatures. From a financial standpoint it has been a challenge to keep our finances afloat, but with some short-term borrowing from our restricted funds we have been able to pay all of our bills on time.

Our giving relative to the budget approved by the congregation in January is down about 20%. Our expenses are pretty well in line with what was budgeted. We have raised in excess of \$6000 towards the retirement of the mortgage on the fellowship hall in Arizona city. We still need about \$30,000 more.

We opened the Food Bank with our first distribution on August 18. To say we had a large crowd would be very much an exaggeration. We will be doing better promotion of the distribution in the future and hope that this ministry is a great success going forward. Thank you to all the volunteers that helped with the first distribution and I look forward to your continued help in the future.

I hope to see you all at worship services on Sundays and have a blessed month and rest of the summer.

Disciple Teams

As we continue to transition from a membership model into a discipleship model, and your council continues its visioning process with a vision consultant, something has become abundantly clear. We need to form teams of disciples. The teams become the core of the disciples being the church.

When I took the call as your pastor at Central Lutheran, I quickly learned that the basics of being church, to be disciples and serving the people of God, were missing. The discipleship sermon series and the book, laid out the basics of being a disciple. When it comes to teams, which are needed to have a fully functional congregation for mission, it requires more than a single pastor running what should be done and not done.



Being part of a team involves multiple marks of discipleship. Serving, giving, and spiritual friendship all play a part in teams. Lois Irvin is the current team lead of the Fellowship Team and she is in need of additional team members. Fellowship was the first team that I asked to be formed. It is important we take the time to fellowship with each other, learn to be church together, as one congregation.

It is now time to start putting other teams together. We have started to form the Stewardship team. We need more committed disciples to make this work. We are a couple of months into a program called, Stewardship for All Seasons. The upcoming study that starts on September 12, is a great way to learn about Stewardship but also to learn about this valuable team to engage with.

A funeral team is needed as well. This congregation is an aging congregation, as such, we have recently had several deaths and more will come. One of the best things we can do for

members, their families and others who morn, is helping for a smoothly organized funeral. When we host funerals or memorials, several things must happen. So far, I have had to reach out to multiple people and ensure other aspects get done. This can be very distracting from the role I take on as pastor and taking care of the family. We need a core set of people and a team lead. This way there is a single point of contact and the other aspects get taken care of, as I take care of the meetings with family, planning the service, leading and preaching.

We need to form a social ministry team, the core of which is to provide needed social services. We do some of these ad-hoc, but to have a team oversee and a team lead to provide direction, can enhance our offerings to serve God's people and reach for more to serve. The ministries we have that can fit under this are: Manna Bags, Quilting given to those in need, Food Bank, Toiletries Collection, Prayer Shawl/ Patch, Good Gifts, and Angel Tree.

There are many more teams that are important to form. Without the teams and the leaders, we are not walking as ministers and disciples in ministry. The body of Christ is missing the necessary limbs for us to carry out ministry in the world. As a congregation, we need to come together and serve, not ourselves but all of God's people.

Each team should have not only full-time residents of the area, but also include the gifted disciples who are our winter guests. The Team Lead should be a full-time resident. This will help provide consistently, no matter what time of the year it is. Please consider being part of the new ministry teams that are forming. Look for others to be formed as well, such as Evangelism, Ushers, Readers, Streaming, Assisting Lay Ministry and more.

Learn who God is calling to you be, becoming engaged in studies. We have upcoming; Spirituality of Stewardship, Walk on Water and Spiritual Gifts. There will be others coming as well. Be engaged, be a serving disciple and reaching out to all for the Kingdom of God.

Community

We have a great opportunity in this community as an ELCA congregation. The ELCA stands for equality for all. This means that your gender, race, previous religious affiliations, baptized as an infant or adult, does not matter. We welcome all and we truly mean all. Not all that are like us or conform. We are open to conversation, reconciliation and do not judge. That is who we strive to be. Not always do we do well, but we strive to be caring about all and loving all.

In our community, we are different than most of the congregations, especially when it comes to other Lutheran denominations. There are a few non-Lutheran's similar to us and in fact we are in full communion with them, meaning we can share the sacraments and even pastors. We are poised to be able to offer something that many other congregations cannot.

We can accept all without judgement. No matter what their worship preferences are, how the dress, whom they marry, the color of their skin, etc., etc. When we do events, such as the concerts, there was no cost and not restrictions. When we have our craft fair, there are no restrictions on who can participate and who can come and shop. These events are community based. We are called to serve all. These events are not for us but for the community. The more we can do in and for the community, the more we can be as God called us, as we try to live out the expressions called by or denomination.

Denomination is not the end all. God is the end all. How we live and express that, is very different than so many other congregations. Many

people have been hurt by congregations and denominations that they do not want to step foot in the doors of another. If we can continue to be open and welcoming, which also means welcoming by having community events, and opening the doors for community events, people will see who we are. This is why we now have a food distribution, why the Itty Bitty Bottle Babies are hosted in Arizona City. As I write this, we opened the doors in Casa Grande for an overdose awareness event.

We always want as many people to participate in what is being done in/at Central Lutheran. Sometimes the participations is showing up and other times it is setting up. Financial support for events either through donations of goods, time or monies is important too. Ultimately, support for God's people outside of the four walls is the ultimate goal. Giving people an opportunity to experience the love of God for them, in Christ Jesus. We do, because of who God made us.



Free Hot Lunch Mission

The Eloy Hot Lunch program is up and running and needs our help.

We need desserts for each Wednesday. Can you bake or buy treats for the hot lunch? Treats do not need to be individually wrapped, but they do need to be "finger food".

In Casa Grande or AZ City stick your treats with a "hot lunch" tag in the church fridge or freezer (plate, bags or boxed) for the ladies to deliver to the program site (just let them know they are there). We need enough for 18 each week.
