First Reading: Service Well-Pleasing to God

Hebrews 13:1-8 (NRSVUE) Lector: Wells Ridenour

Let mutual affection continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them, those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Second Reading: Humility and Hospitality

Luke 14:1, 7-14 (NRSVUE) Rev. Katie Penick

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the Sabbath, they were watching him closely. When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host, and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."



Journeys Adult Class: This adult class will continue to be offered virtually via ZOOM and will be studying "The Parables for Today's World," a special study created by Sue Graff.



Harry completed a 5-year study program (*Order of Jerusalem*) through the West Virginia School of Religion and earned a Master in Divinity Degree from Virginia Theological Seminary. In 1981 he was ordained an Episcopal Priest and in 1991 he transferred his credentials and was ordained in the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches (UFMCC). He served as Pastor of the MCC Church of the Disciples for 14 years and served on the faculty of Samaritan Institute of Religious Studies for 10 years where he taught "*Homosexuality and the Bible"* and "*Introduction to Sexuality Studies."* He has been facilitating this Seminar for 30 years in churches and colleges in California, Florida, Maryland, Virginia, Ohio, Washington, DC, Arizona, Pennsylvania, Delaware, South Carolina and West Virginia. He is the founder and president of Scrolls Revealed Ministries and he currently serves as Parish Partner at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Washington DC and lives with his partner Mark of 43 years in Waldorf, Maryland.
