Message from the Chair

When does the year start for you? What do you regard as a new beginning? Different people will answer in different ways. There's the calendar year starting in January, the financial year starting in April, the Church's year starting with Advent in November or early December. For me, it would be September. Possibly through association with the academic year. And so many things start again in September after a summer break.

Within Churches Together, the monthly Prayer breakfast resumes on Saturday 24 September, at 8.30am at St John's, Farncombe. Prayer is such an important part of our common Christian life and it would be lovely to see more people there.

Another ecumenical prayer initiative begins this September. Enough people responded to last month's notice about the Julian Meetings contemplative prayer group to make it viable. The Godalming Julian Meeting will take place at 8.00pm at St John's, Farncombe, once a month, on the second Tuesday, so this month on Tuesday 13 September. Anyone is welcome – contemplative prayer is for the many not for the few.

Now could be a good time to renew our commitment to supporting Ukrainian refugees in our community. The Homes for Ukraine scheme began in March with placements lasting an initial six months. That period is coming to an end. Data suggests that the majority of placements will continue beyond September, but many will not, as the increasing cost of living makes it harder for householders to continue hosting their guests. Many of these refugees may find themselves homeless. Do we know of any in particular need in this area? As church members, and individuals, let us keep our eyes open to what is happening around us and be prepared to show that our faith makes a difference.

Godalming Minster

On Monday 11 July 2022, the PCCs of Busbridge Church, Hambledon Church and St Peter and Paul with St Mark's Churches voted on the proposal to unite and become a Minster Parish for the Godalming and wider area.

The PCC members are the Trustees of their parishes, so the matter was taken seriously and they all spent considerable time in thought, preparation and prayer.

Now the Minster proposal has been passed by all PCCs by a clear individual and collective majority, there will be meetings over the coming weeks for all church members where details of the proposal will be fully explored with lots of opportunities for questions. We will also gather for more prayer times.

There will be a special Annual Parochial Church Meeting with Archdeacon Paul on Sunday 2 October, following the All-Age Harvest Thanksgiving Service, for further prayer and ratification of the PCC's decision.
