Westminster Shorter Catechism #2: What authority from God directs us how to glorify and enjoy Him? The only authority for glorifying and enjoying Him is the Bible, which is the word of God and is made up of the Old and New Testaments.

The Lord's Supper at Westminster is for all those who have received Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, who do now repent, endeavor to live a holy life, and have publicly professed their faith through membership in an evangelical church. Children who have not publicly confessed Christ by being received by the Session into communicant Church membership should refrain from the Sacrament and learn by reverent observation; this, even though they may already have received Christ privately. Those without personal saving faith in Jesus Christ are to refrain from the Sacrament and are urged to repent and receive Him by faith.
