We will find a good spot, drop the anchor, sit on the pontoon and enjoy the show shot from the Raccoon State Park. I believe it is having the same effect on my grandkids as sitting on the hood at the drive-in had on me. By the way, if I seem a little groggy on Sunday morning after the fireworks, you will know why.

Rockville First United Methodist Church Administrative Council Minutes May 17, 2022

Ad Council members present: Rob Belcher, Mary Jane Evens, Diana Ruark, Mark Spelbring, Bill Becker, Randy Randall, Carol Keller, Alex Milligan

Absent: Maddie Belcher, Pastor Jon Overbey, Merideth McGill,

Council Business

Rob Belcher opened the meeting with prayer.

The April minutes were approved.

Interior Design committee: Elaine Waltz presented carpet samples and carpet ideas for the Council to consider. Elaine also discussed the idea of installing laminate in the Chapel and hallways which would raise the quote from \$25,000 to \$35,000. That quote would include the Sanctuary, Chapel and hallway. We have been "penciled in" by Patton's for July installment.

OLD BUSINESS:

Handicap Ramp update: There is a discrepancy in the handrail quote. The contractor is wanting to raise the bid \$9800. The handrail is on hold until this discrepancy can be cleared up. Bill Becker will talk with Andy Willhite, City Welding, for suggestions of something cheaper.

Plaster update: There are 2 spots in need of repair, the balcony, north vestibule, water comes off the top of the tower. There is a drain there. Purdy, the brick contractor, will be here to check. Mark Downing will finish the plaster work once this is taken care of.

Classroom update: The exterior doors have been ordered. We cannot paint until we know what's going to be done with the windows and electric is installed. We have approximately 10 panels to install for the other classrooms. All was in agreement to open the suggestion up to the congregation to "adopt" a panel. The cost would be approximately \$200 per panel.

Nursery update: Mark Downing will build or have built the framing for the new windows in the boy scout & nursery rooms and install the new windows.

Painting information: Bill Becker reported 12 contractors were contacted, out of 12, 7 responded. Out of 7 responses 2 bids were received. Mid-West Precision Coatings was chosen. They are required to use Sherwin Williams paint.

Stained glass glazing: [plexiglass covering] Bovart Studios, Fairfield, IA, was contacted. The glazing now in place was installed in 1996 for \$30,000, to replace the glazing with the same product is \$60,000. That would include some small repairs to the trim. Also, the bottom windows would be sealed shut. Rob Belcher will contact the Amish that own Eagle/Mid-West windows for a quote.

NEW BUSINESS:

Leave Days: With all the family incidences going on between Pastor Jon and Kathy's families, it was decided to give them time off needed, without make up days.

Mary Jane Evens will purchase wind chimes for Pastor Jon and Gale in memory of Jessica.

Finance Report:

Mary Jane Evens gave the financial Report. Mark Spelbring reviewed the Budget.

Martha Holaday is requesting an increase in the allotment for Fellowship Diner. The allotment has been increased \$25/month.

Staff Parish Relations Report:

Diana Ruark was welcomed as the SPRC-Chair. Diana has been in contact with various people of the West District conference to introduce herself. She has been signed up with the conference as Church Parish. There is no spring assessment for Clergy.

Ministry Reports (Lay leader, Women's Rep, Men's Rep, At-Large)

Randy Randall reported that the Illini 4000 Bikers will arrive June 7th and will depart on June 8th after a breakfast of pancakes and sausage. Randy requested \$50 to take the bikers to the fair grounds to shower.

Celebrate Recovery inquired about having a garage sale in June or July. It was decided the garage sale could not be held at the church with all the remodeling taking place.

Bicentennial Committee:

The committee is continuing to work on the church history book. The newsletters through 2021 have been reviewed to pick out important events. The committee has a quote for printing from Staples of \$2300.

The Bicentennial Committee has asked each program within the church will write a letter describing their program and it will be included in the next letter to be sent out for the 200th Anniversary. It was discussed to celebrate one of our programs each month in June/July/August with a meal. The last Sunday in June will be used as a kick-off for the 200th Anniversary.

Alex Milligan closed the meeting in prayer.
