You know you are out west when you walk into the leather goods section of the store and not only do you see a lot of cowboy boots and hats, but there are many chaps, and all kinds of real gun belts. And people are buying them!

August is also the time for the State Fair. When we get back we will be going to the State Fair with Norah, our grand daughter. Her photography entry in the Hendricks County Fair gained her the Grand Champion Ribbon. We will go with her and the family to see how she made out with the state level competition. I'm sure grandma and grandpa will be springing for some rides and fair food while we are there.

The meeting was brought to order and a prayer was given by R. Belcher.

Minutes from the May 17, 2022 meeting were read and approved.


Committee Updates

Trustees Items:

- **I. Interior Design-**Sanctuary Paint colors are chosen. Sanctuary carpet selection has been made. We need written quotes from Patton's in Kingman and Feld's in Greencastle.
- **2. Ramp Handrail Update**-Reviewed Purdy contract and pricing. Original rail quote was \$9,200, now it is \$9,800. Cost of railing direct with City Welding, \$16,500. We are currently withholding last payment of \$7,000.00 from Purdy. Final decision and action needs taken.
- 3. Tower Final Plaster Repair-this will be completed after Purdy makes final repairs in north tower.
- **4. Basement Update** -Painting-after discussion the board decided to keep the wall color uniform in all classrooms. Other proposed wall colors will need to be brought to the Board for approval. Nursery room is finished-repainted. Waiting on window repair in nursery and exterior door replacement in west classrooms. Janitor closet-ceiling to be drywalled but not completely finished to allow access to plumbing; holes will be repaired, walls painted, sink replaced, water main-shut off to be clearly marked.
- **5. Painting in Sanctuary and Chapel**-Midwest Precision Coatings, Rosedale will start June 27. A decision for removing drapes, tables and chairs needs to be made and action taken. A down payment has been made.
- **6. Painting to be Addressed-**Fellowship Hall, York Street entry.
- 7. Administrative Council Update-still need a men's representative to the council.
- **8. Secretary Coverage-**We need coverage in the office for 10 days while Kathy's husband, Dan, has surgery and recovery beginning 6/29. Kathy will be in periodically. Our prayers for them.
- **9. Dinner after Church** June 26, 2022-This is a Pre-200 Celebration Dinner. Meat will be provided. Bring a covered dish and enjoy fellowship.
- 8. Update on Conference-Pastor's Report- Information was given by Pastor Jon.
- **9. Block Party-Main Street sponsored event** July 30, 2022. FUMC is a Mainstreet member and has been asked to man games for this event. Main Street contact person is Cassidy Helms 765-365-2574 for clarification on games. We will need people to volunteer to help with this event, as well as County Fair booth in the Commercial Building for Monday-Thursday evenings.
- **IO. Finance Report-**Low on Budgeted Funding-Paid painters down payment has offset the budget. Some items are becoming harder to order ie: copy paper. Stamps will go up again this summer.
- 11. Staff Parish-No report.
- **12. Illini 4000 Report**-Update from R. Randall. This sponsored event went well. Thanks to Bill Becker for housing 4 riders. Thanks to all who helped, cooked, donated snacks and Randy for dedicated organization.
- **13.** Centennial Celebration-Reservation Letters have been mailed. Apparel will soon be ordered. Information on cost of printing a history book is being gathered. Celebration meal is planned. Program is being finalized.

Next meeting is July 19. 2022 at 6:30 p.m. Pastor Jon closed the meeting with prayer. Meeting was dismissed.

There are many capital improvements projects going on this year. There are also some private projects such as the fellowship hall basement improvements that different people in the church have taken on. There are two projects that have not been completed because funding the projects have not been completely funded.

The first project is the basement wall panels. There are still about ten panels that need funding. Each panel cost is \$200.00.

The second project is the updating to the fellowship hall upstairs women's bathroom. The sink needs to be replaced and a new baby changing station needs to be installed. This project needs about \$500.00 to \$600.00 funding.






