We join with our brothers and sisters up and down the country and across the commonwealth and her realms in mourning the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

There will be many acts of national mourning and remembrance over the coming days. Prayer for those who have died is an important part of what we do for them and for ourselves and early on Friday morning I offered a Requiem Mass for her at St Edmund's. It struck me that this is a most ancient of rites and one thing that will have been done in churches up and down the land for as long as there have been kings and queens in England, even in penal times.

The 6pm Mass on this Saturday evening will be a Requiem Mass for Her Majesty and there will be prayers for the repose of her soul and for God's grace for King Charles at all our Masses this weekend. Details of other events will emerge over the coming days.

Drawing on one of the most significant Eastern Eucharistic prayers it uses a structure which also expresses our communion with the Eastern Churches, including Ukraine.
